I understand people aren't taking up Digital TV and you are looking into it

May I suggest some reasons

what is the benefit anyway? why do I want it?

there is only limited broadcast product, as I understand it?

there has been a launch of Flat, Wide, High Definition, Cable TV, Plasma, LED, Digital some of which prices at \$15000 for a TV, so what should we buy? does Digital go hand in hand with High Definition & Plasma or are these different things?
