There are too many examples of privatization of essential services being extremly detrimental to the consummer.

A most recent example being the 350%price hike in electricity in S.A. when the gass suply from Moomba was in jepeordy.

*There are concerns that the fragmentation of a "consummer friendly" one stop shop concept with a total package of services as provided through the Telstra Country Wide model will lead to a breakdown on advice of interrelated and connected services, supplies and enhanced services.

(The current system allows for all requirements of services to be advised from across the breadth of Telstra Departments)

* There are concerns that the revenue raising and highly finnancial streams will be pulled out and sold off, most likely to overseas companies, as attractive commercial ventures with out the same commitment to rural, regional and remote consummers.

(The infrastructure to support extended service supply to all communities will not have it's high cost of installation offset hence impacting on higher costs to users).

* There are also concerns that the ability and independance of Telstra to -at it's discretion ,assist with service, sponsorship and support. Packages to communities, groups and organizations, will be inhibited if it does not own a full range of services.
