Following are brief comments on the above enquiry

- 1. The prevention of damage by fruit bats to my crop is adding about 60 cents per tray to my production costs. This was necessary after a loss of 100% of the crop in 1998
- 2. Current water reforms in NSW are advantaging non-commercial users eg. landscaping, at the expense of productive agriculture
- 3. Native Vegetation Legislation
- a) places restrictions on earning potential of the landholders investment. The most affected is the landholder who has been practising conservation
- b) The community wants to put restrictions on landholders but don't want to pay.
- c) There needs to be a much greater emphasis on education rather than regulation.
 - d) Incentive funding is important but is it being correctly targeted
- e) Incentive funding helps those who are already keen to do something but what about compensation for those that are restricted.
