Independent Contracting and Labour Hire Arrangements What's happening in WA?

The Chamber of Commerce and Industry WA, UnionsWA and a labour hire company are to appear before a House of Representatives committee inquiry into independent contracting and labour hire arrangements.

The Chamber of Commerce and Industry WA supports the Australian Government's proposal to protect the rights of independent contractors in legislation, and the overriding of state legislation of deeming certain workers to be employees. Tricord Personnel is one labour hire company that has been in the courts involving a decision on whether workers were independent contractors or employees. This decision then has implications for unfair dismissal claims and other workplace legislation.

The Committee Chair, Phil Barresi, said the growth in labour hire has provided many organisations with greater flexibility in meeting work demands.

"Concerns regarding occupational health and safety, and skills development require the Committee to look closely at the responsibilities of labour hire agencies, client organisations and the workers involved," Mr Barresi said.

"Strong defence of independent contracting arrangements has been provided to the Committee as a beneficial work and lifestyle choice. However, claims that workers are being pressured to convert to such arrangements need to be investigated," Mr Barresi said.

The hearing in Perth on Friday 20 May 9:00 am to 12: 30 pm is the final interstate hearing for the Committee.
