## Stage 2 of Norfolk Island governance review

Federal parliament's External Territories Committee has been asked by the federal Minister for Territories to look into the sustainability of the current governmental arrangements on Norfolk Island. What range of government activities can the current government machinery on Norfolk Island deliver at an appropriate level—more, less or the same as at present? Will Island revenues meet the costs of an ageing population and declining infrastructure? How have the Island's lawmaking processes and legal regime kept pace with changing requirements?
