Report

- 1. Your Committee has considered again the matter of days and hours of meeting as contained in standing order 40.
- 2. In its Report of 10 June 1970 your Committee recommended that sitting days and hours be changed and that the sittings be based on a four-day week, two weeks of sitting and one week off. This matter was considered in the House on 3 September 1970 when the Committee's recommendation was debated and agreed to, after amendment.
 - 3. The new standing order 40 came into operation on 13 October 1970.
- 4. Your Committee was informed that experience had shown that the present sitting pattern had not proved as efficient or convenient as anticipated and that the large majority of Members favoured a return to the pattern of sittings previously in use.
- 5. Your Committee agrees that, in the light of the experience, a change should be made and therefore recommends that standing order 40 be omitted and the following standing order be inserted in place thereof:

Days and hours of meeting

40. Unless otherwise ordered, the House shall meet for the despatch of business on each Tuesday and Wednesday at half-past two o'clock p.m.; and on each Thursday at half-past ten o'clock a.m.
