DUTIES OF THE COMMITTEE

Section 8 of the *Public Accounts Committee Act 1951-1966* reads as follows:

8. The duties of the Committee are—

- (a) to examine the accounts of the receipts and expenditure of the Commonwealth and each statement and report transmitted to the Houses of Parliament by the Auditor-General in pursuance of sub-section (1.) of section fifty-three of the *Audit Act 1901-1951*;
 - (b) to report to both Houses of the Parliament, with such comment as it thinks fit, any items or matters in those accounts, statements and reports, or any circumstances connected with them, to which the Committee is of the opinion that the attention of the Parliament should be directed;
 - (c) to report to both Houses of the Parliament any alteration which the Committee thinks desirable in the form of the public accounts or in the method of keeping them, or in the mode of receipts, control, issue or payment of public moneys; and
 - (d) to inquire into any question in connexion with the public accounts which is referred to it by either House of the Parliament, and to report to that House upon that question,
- and include such other duties as are assigned to the Committee by Joint Standing Orders approved by both Houses of the Parliament.

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FOREWORD

On 18 March 1971, the Committee presented to the Parliament in its One Hundred and Twenty-fifth Report an Index to the first One Hundred and fourteen reports of the Joint Committee of Public Accounts. The present Index covers the One hundred and Forty-two reports issued by the first eight Committees in the period of twenty years between the appointment of the first Committee on 25 September 1952, and the presentation of the One Hundred and Forty-second Report, the final Report of the Eighth Committee, on 24 October 1972.

The Index also includes on page 13 a list of reports, One Hundred and Forty-three to One Hundred and Fifty-two, presented by the Ninth and Tenth Committees between 24 October 1972 and 4 December 1974. The substance of these reports is not included in the Index.

The method of compilation of this Index is similar to that adopted previously. Topics have been listed under main subject headings and then is indicated the number of report and the page, or the first of a succession of pages, in that report where the topic will be found. Government departments are indexed uniformly under the key name of the department, e.g., 'Foreign Affairs Department' and not 'Department of Foreign Affairs'. Authorities whose formal titles commence with 'Commonwealth' or 'Australia' are so indexed with a cross reference under a commonly used name, for example, 'Australian Wheat Board' is indexed under 'Australian' with a cross reference under 'Wheat Board'. Treasury Minutes, conveying to the Committee the action taken by the Treasury and departments on their reports, are indexed under 'Treasury Minutes'.

The following example will illustrate the way in which the Index is to be interpreted:—
