The Joint Committee on the Australian Capital Territory was first appointed by resolution of both Houses of Parliament in 1957 and has been re-appointed in succeeding Parliaments. Both Houses resolved to appoint a Joint Committee on the last sitting day in 1956 but time did not permit the appointment of members. The present Committee was appointed for the life of the 31st Parliament by resolutions of the Senate and the House of Representatives in March 1978.

The duties of the Committee as specified in its Resolution of Appointment are to:

- (a) examine and report on all proposals for modification or variations of the plan of lay-out of the City of Canberra and its environs published in the Commonwealth of Australia Gazette on 19 November, 1925, as previously modified or varied, which are referred to the Committee by the Minister for the Capital Territory, and
- (b) examine and report on such other matters relating to the Australian Capital Territory as may be referred to the Committee -
 - (i) by the Minister for the Capital Territory, or
 - (ii) by resolution of either House of the Parliament.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee approves variations 1 to 4 and 6 to 11 contained in the 71st Series.

Introduction

*

- 1. In the Commonwealth of Australia Gazette of 15 July 1980, the Minister for the Capital Territory, the Hon. R.J. Ellicott, Q.C., M.P., pursuant to the powers conferred on him by section 12A of the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910, notified his intention to vary the plan of layout of the City of Canberra and its environs. Members of the public were invited to lodge objections in writing with the Secretary of the Department of the Capital Territory within 21 days of the publication specifying the grounds of those objections.
- 2. As part of its policy to stimulate public interest in an discussion on the proposals, the Department of the Capital Territory (DCT) advertised the variations in the Canberra Times on 4 occasions between 19 July and 30 July 1980. Displays showing the proposals were arranged by the DCT at the Belconnen Mall, Monaro Mall, Dickson Library, Woden Plaza, Cooleman Court and the Erindale Centre, Wanniassa.
- 3. On 11 July 1980, pursuant to paragraph 1(a) of the Resolution of Appointment of this Committee, the items contained in the Minister's proposals, and designated the 71st Series, were formally referred by the Minister for investigation and report. The Minister's letter referring these proposals for the Committee's consideration is at Appendix I.
- 4. The Committee, in keeping with the practice established in the 30th Parliament, held a public hearing on the proposals on 13 August 1980. Some 11 witnesses representing 8 organisations and individuals appeared at the hearing. A list of the witnesses who appeared before the Committee is at Appendix II. The transcript of evidence given at those hearings will be available for inspection at the Committee Office of the House of Representatives and at the National Library.

- 5. The Committee is conscious of the role of the A.C.T. House of Assembly as representing the views of citizens of the A.C.T. On three previous occasions a representative of the appropriate committee of the House of Assembly has appeared before this Committee. On this occasion it was not possible to have a House of Assembly representative appear, however this Committee had the Report of the House of Assembly Standing Committee on Finance available to it when considering this report. The House of Assembly Committees agrees to the variations.
- 6. The National Capital Development Commission (NCDC) and DCT supplied jointly prepared briefing notes which set out the background to the variations. These briefing notes form Appendix III. The Gazette notifying the variations and detailed maps form Appendix IV. For the sake of brevity details contained in the briefing notes are not repeated, unless necessary, in the Committee's Report. The briefing notes explain details of the variations such as the purpose, cost, existing and proposed development and the extent of community consultation. The Committee's Report should therefore be read in conjunction with the briefing notes and the transcript of evidence. The cost involved in the proposals is in excess of \$1.4m. However three of the proposals have not cost.

Variation 1 - Spence

- 7. This proposal is to remedy an administrative error resulting from the 48th Series of Variations in September 1971. At present there is a lease encroaching onto the gazetted road reservation of Kingsford Smith Drive. The proposed variation will overcome the situation and the Committee was told that the leaseholder has been informed of the proposal and has no objections to it.
- 8. The Committee approves the variation.

Variation 2 - Belconnen, Section 54

9. In its report on the 68th Series of Variations (Nov 79) the Committee rejected two proposed variations in the Belconnen Town Centre. These were objected to by the Camberra Revival Centre and the Camberra Commercial Development Authority. The Committee referred to the apparent confusion and uncertainty created by the proposed changes. In that Report the Committee recommended:

'the preparation of a comprehensive management plan for the Belconnen Town Centre be expedited and that no further decisions be taken with respect to the development of Section 54 of the Town Centre until this is done (with the exception of the Library). In addition, the Committee stresses that this should be done in close consultation with those involved in the development of the Town Centre'.

10. The Draft Policy Plan for the Belconnen Town Centre was published by NCDC in July of this year and the responses to it are now being considered. This proposal, which is supported by both the Canberra Commercial Development Authority and the Canberra Revival Centre is for the deletion of part of a road reservation off Chandler Street and the addition of a road

reservation off Benjamin Way. The proposed road will provide access to the Belconnen Town Library as does the road which it is proposed to delete. The proposed change is in accord with the Draft policy plan.

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- 11. At the hearing concern was expressed about the complicated traffic movements which will be involved to gain access to the Library, particularly for those persons travelling north on Benjamin Way. The Committee was subsequently advised that the Commission has an approved opening planned in the median of Benjamin Way to permit northbound traffic to turn right into the carpark and thus provide access to the cul-de-sac and complete the loop onto Benjamin Way.²
- 12. However, the Committee will seek further details on this matter and has written to the NCDC.
- 13. The Committee approves the variation.

Variation 3 ~ Bruce, Section 8

- 14. This proposal, is to allow the construction of a bus-stop at the main entrance to the National Indoor Sports Centre in Bruce. According to NCDC a reservation of this type is necessary so that it can be utilised by numbers of buses when a major sporting event occurs.
- 15. Action for Public Transport did not oppose the construction of the bus-stop but suggested that it should be designed as part of the inter-town bus route. At the hearing the Committee was advised that this bus-stop is directly related and adjacent to the proposed inter-town bus route. However, 'the staging of that [route] is very dependent on how quickly they [the need for services] build up and which is the optimum route'.
- 16. The Committee approves the variation.

- 17. This proposal is to meet the needs of an office development and convention centre proposed for Section 60. The project is valued at \$50m+\$60m and would provide office accommodation for 2000 employees. The proposed road, which is 354 metres in length, will link Bunda Street and Constitution Avenue. There were three objections: one was concerned with the resultant increase in traffic, another with the loss of open space, while the third dealt with the principle of taxpayers in general being forced to fund roads being used by only part of the community.
- 18. The Committee was advised that while 'the proposed road has been designed in such a way as to preserve the line of quite valuable eucalypts', fifteen to twenty mature trees would be lost. The ACT House of Assembly expressed concern at the proposal to remove the trees and requested NCDC to undertake a replacement tree planting program. NCDC advised that a plan is being prepared for the landscape development of Glebe Park which covers much of the area. The Committee was informed that Glebe Park is to be gazetted as parkland.
- 19. According to NCDC traffic would increase as a result of the proposed development;

There will be some increase in traffic, but not very much. The present prediction is that by 1990 traffic flow at the intersection of Binara and Bunda Streets will rise from the present flow of about 700 vehicles an hour in the peak hours to 800 vehicles an hour. So it is not a significant increase.

20. The Committee was also advised that the question of car parking is under consideration by NCDC and a report on this should be available by September of this year. NCDC did not see any significant difficulty in coping with the parking problem and made reference to efforts to encourage a gradual move to public transport.

- 21. The Committee believes that efforts to gazette Glebe Park as parkland should be expedited so as to preserve valuable public open space which will be open to visitors to Canberra as well as local residents. The Committee has noted that \$100,000 has been included in the NCDC 1980/81 Construction Programme for the development of Glebe Park. The work will include land formation, irrigation, grassing, paying and general upgrading.
- 22. The Committee approves the variation.

Variation 5 - Deakin, Section 12

- 23. There is no construction activity involved in this proposal, which is to provide lease frontage for a site to be released for commercial development. The proposal involves the gazettal of an existing access road and car park. A building of 500 square metres is to be erected on the site and 'the lease purpose clause for the site says that it is for the purpose of medical and other professional offices'.
- 24. Two objections were made to the proposed change. One referred to the 'dubious' planning approach and piecemeal development as well as the lack of permanent public recreational space. The other suggested that the development of the block for medical and professional offices is contrary to normal planning principles. It was also suggested that the proposal was contrary to proposals by NCDC for the use of the land. It was suggested that the site be used for a children's playground which would be more in keeping with the image of the area.
- 25. The poor visual impact of the car park and road was acknowledged by NCDC and reference was made to efforts to overcome this. 'We already have planted trees in that area and a landscaping action has been projected in an attempt to overcome some of those problems.' At the hearing NCDC referred to a

children's playground on the other side of the car park. 'The landscaping work that we are carrying out will incorporate a children's playground to the west of the car park.'

26. The playground will be ... 'the type of facility that one sees in many parks around Canberra'. 9 NCDC also provided the following comment as background to the decision on the land use for the site.

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'... from the Commission's point of view there was a vacant site there that was considered initially as part of the car parking area. When we went in to detail to consider the car parking it was recognised that it did not assist in the provision of car parking. It was really much better to provide that long strip of car parking. That extra piece of land did not give any further car parking. We then approached the DCT and said that there was a site between three existing sites for commercial use and we asked the Department to seek expressions of interest on that site. Our overall land use policy was for commercial use. The Department, after considering expressions of interest, came back to us and said that in conformity with the joint exercise that we had carried out with the Department on medical and dental practices, this site was suitable for those practices. We agreed to the description of the lease purpose clause.' 10

The Committeee is not satisfied with the information it has received on this matter or with the planning of the area involved. The Committee has therefore requested additional information on this issue and has now been provided with over 160 pages of correspondence and file notes. Even though the proposed development is a commercial one it would seem not to be entirely compatible with the adjoining leases which are for sporting and recreational activities and there remains uncertainty about a proposed nursing home in the immediate area.

27. The Committee does not approve the variation but may comment further on this proposal in its Report on the 72nd Series of Variations.

Variation 6 ~ Weston Creek District, North of Cotter Road

- 28. This development is in response to a need to identify tourist related sites that can be made available to private enterprise. Kirkpatrick Street will be connected to the Cotter Road and there will be a loop road added to serve the proposed tourist sites. The Committee was advised that there are a number of tourist activities under consideration for the area.
- 29. The Committee was also informed that the environmental consequences of upgrading the road are minimal. 'The proposed road in its major part goes through a clearing in the pines. Not a tree is to be removed. In general it follows an existing lane to come back through a clearing. The impact on the landscape is absolutely minimal.' The policy plan for the area is to be discussed with residents this month and the NCDC undertook to discuss it also with the RSPCA.
- 30. The Committee approves the variation.

Variation 7 - Deakin, Section 37

- 31. This area of Deakin has been set aside for national institutions. However, it has now been found that some institutions require smaller sites than those presently provided. According to NCDC: 'We have found recently that some of the institutions are now looking for smaller sites ... we are looking for a way of introducing smaller sites so that their offices can be built adjacent in a duplex form. The purpose of this gazettal is to provide two courtyards which would free one site and enable us to release two sites for smaller institutions in the area.' 12 The Committee was also told that NCDC is 'considering not only these sites but also some of the ones in a nearby area to offer a greater range of size and to encourage the action the Canberra Development Board is taking'. 13
- 32. The Committee approves the variation.

Variation 8 - Stirling, Section 24

- 33. This proposal is for a car park to provide access to the new oval at the Stirling District Playing Fields. The road to the car park has already been gazetted and it is proposed to incorporate this car park on the plan along with the other car parking areas in that part of Stirling Park. This is part of a general proposal to upgrade the oval including a pavilion, club amenities and irrigation of the playing fields.
- 34. The Committee approves the variation.

Variation 9 - Narrabundah, Section 124

- 35. This is another proposal for the gazettal of a car park access and will allow lease access to two buildings in the area. One building will be leased to the YMCA while the other will be leased to the Creative Leisure Movement which uses the building 'to foster the creative imagination of children under five years of age so that by gradual development they will be able to express their own thoughts and emotions'. 14
- 36. There are no costs involved in the proposal nor are there any special environmental considerations.
- 37. The Committee approves the variation.

Variation 10 - Tuggeranong, Point Hut Road

38. It is proposed to reconstruct the Point Hut Road between Tharwa Road and Point Hut Crossing since 'the road pavement has deteriorated and short term treatment as part of the maintenance programme is no longer economic'. 15 A further proposal is to degazette the present picnic area from the road reservation and then to gazette the picnic area as a public park under the Public Parks Ordinance.

- 39. One of the reasons for the deterioration of the road is its use by heavy vehicles which are precluded from using the Tharwa Bridge. According to NCDC the present Tharwa Bridge load is 20 tonnes but 'from time to time, as the bridge deteriorates before maintenance, we reduce that load limit. So at some times all vehicles other than cars have to come around and use the Point Hut Road'. The Committee was advised that a report recommending an alignment and type of bridge construction for the replacement of Tharwa Bridge would be prepared by April 1981.
- 40. Other picnic areas in Canberra, including most of the popular picnic areas such as the Cotter Reserve, Casuarina Sands, Pine Island and Kambah Pool Reserve have already been gazetted as public parks. Removal of the Point Hut picnic area from the road reservation will allow its gazettal as a park.
- 41. The Committee approves the variation.

Variation 11 - Tharwa, Block 10, Section 6

- 42. The purpose of this variation is to rectify an encroachment by amending a block boundary to include the encroachment in the property. According to DCT the variation will, in effect, 'only regularise a situation which has existed for many, many years'. The lessee has been consulted about it and agrees with the proposal.
- 43. This method of dealing with the encroachment should not be regarded as a precedent and DCT advised that should it 'come across somebody in one of the newer suburbs with an encroachment

like that we would not be quite as favourably inclined to propose a variation'. 18 The extent of the encroachment ranges from 1.635 metres at one end of the block to 'virtually nothing' 19 at the other.

The Committee approves the variation. 44.

These briefing notes are intended to supplement the information contained in the notice of intention to vary the plan of layout of the City of Canberra and its environs which was published in Gazette No. S158 of 15 July 1980. They have been prepared for the inquiry by the Joint Parliamentary Committee on the Australian Capital Territory into the 71st series of variations to the plan.

These variations were referred to the Committee by the Minister for the Capital Territory on 11 July 1980, pursuant to paragraph 1(a) of the Committee's instrument of appointment.

The 71st series comprises eleven items, eight of which are sponsored by the National Capital Development Commission and three by the Department of the Capital Territory.

Copies of all objections and submissions received as a result of the Department's publicity of the proposals are included with these notes.

NOTE ON THE 70TH SERIES OF VARIATIONS

The 70th series of variations to the City Plan was published in the Gazette on 5 June 1980.

The Joint Committee on the ACT held public hearings into the proposed variations on Wednesday 16 and Thursday 17 July 1980.

The variations are still under consideration by the Committee.

PUBLIC INFORMATION

As part of its policy to stimulate public interest and discussion in the proposals, the Department mounted displays showing all of the variations at the Belconnen Mall, Monaro Mall, Dickson Library, Woden Plaza, Cooleman Court and the Erindale Centre, Wanniassa. The Department also advertised the variations in the Canberra Times on four occasions between 19 July and 30 July 1980.

The Department would again like to express its thanks to the managements of the shopping centres and to the Erindale Centre and Dickson Library for their co-operation in making space available for the displays.

On Friday 1 August 1980, officers of the Department and the Commission briefed members of the Finance Committee of the ACT House of Assembly on matters of interest to the Committee relating to this series of variations.







BRUCE, SECTION 8

1. PURPOSE

To gazette a portion of land adjacent to Leverrier Street, Bruce, to cater for a bus set-down area at the main entrance of the National Indoor Sports Centre.

2. AREA

Approximately 1160m², i.e. (145m x 8m)

3. ESTIMATED COST

\$40,000.

4. EXISTING DEVELOPMENT

Block 12 Section 8 is an area reserved for the construction of the National Indoor Sports Centre. The National Athletics Stadium is situated on the adjacent Block 10.

5. PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

A feasibility study has been completed for the construction of the future National Swimming Centre on the adjacent Block θ_*

6. Particular Planning Considerations

This variation will enable a bus set-down to be constructed before the National Indoor Sports Centre is opened in January 1981.


7. ENVIRON-ENTAL CONSIDERATIONS

The proposed set-down will be adjacent to the existing access way (Leverrier Street) and no environmental considerations apply.

VARIATION 4. MAP N5

CITY, SECTIONS 41, 59 AND 60

1. PURPOSE

To vary the Plan by gazetting an extension to Bunda Street, City, from its existing intersection with Binara Street, south-westerly to intersect with Constitution Avenue.

Construction of this new road will provide access to sites for the proposed Convention Centre/Hotel and Offices. The planning for this development is now in progress.

2. LENGTH

The length of road proposed for gazettal is approximately 354m.

3. ESTIMATED COST

\$750,000 for roadwork and associated drainage.

4. EXISTING DEVELOPMENT

Generally the land is undeveloped. Part of the proposed road reservation includes an ungazetted access lane from Constitution Avenue to the old Reid House Hostel and an open drain.

There are existing mature trees within the proposed road reservation. Few trees would have to be removed from the actual road carriageway. However, associated servicing and drainage works may affect others. Adjacent land uses include the central block of Reid house used for a number of community activities; temporary car parking and Glebe Park.

5. FUTURE DEVELOPMENT

It is proposed that adjacent development will consist of offices and an international convention centre with hotel. Glebe Park will be progressively developed as a City Park.

6. PARTICULAR PLANNING CONSIDERATIONS

The road will serve an important development area in terms of City Centre growth.


7. ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS

The alignment of the road has been arranged to preserve as many mature trees as possible but it is expected that some 15-20 trees may require

The total length of the carpark is approximately 185 metres but requires gazettal for only 70 metres of that length.

3. ESTIMATED COST

Nil - the carpark is already constructed. The Parliamentary Joint Committee on the ACT was advised on 23 April 1979 that it may be necessary to gazette the carpark after its construction should a decision be made to lease the small parcal of land created by the development of the carpark. That decision has now been taken.

4. EXISTING DEVELOPMENT

Block 16, Section 12, Deakin is adjacent to the Deakin Health Spa (Block 8, Section 12 Deakin), Central Squash Courts (Block 12, Section 12, Deakin) and the ACT Bridge Association Inc. (Block 14, Section 15, Deakin).

5. PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

It is proposed that a small building of approximately 500 aquare metres will be constructed on Block 16. Section 12. Deakin for commercial use.

6. PARTICULAR PLANNING CONSIDERATIONS

The proposed site is close to parking, public transport and facilities associated with medical and small commercial uses.

It is therefore considered most suitable for the type of development proposed.


Residents in Macgregor, Jervois and Buxton Streets, Deakin, have expressed concern at the visual impact of the carpark, the apparent lack of

WESTON CREEK DISTRICT, NORTH OF COTTER ROAD

1. PURPOSE

To gazette a western extension to Kirkpatrick Street, from its present reservation, to reconnect with Cotter Road, and the addition of a loop road off Kirkpatrick Street, near Block 675, Weston Creek District, to serve proposed tourist sites.

2. LENGTH

The length of road proposed for Gazettal is approximately 0.9 kilometres.

3. ESTIMATED COST

Cost of road construction is approximately \$330,000.

4. EXISTING DEVELOPMENT

Existing development in the area consists of extensive pine plantations, the disused Weston Creek Sewage Treatment Works, sites occupied by the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals and several cottages for Department of Housing and Construction workers. Further back from Kirkpatrick street is the Joint Services Staff College, and the Australian National University and CSIRO plots for experimental plantings.

5. PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

This area has been identified for tourist related developments and there has been a significant amount of interest shown by private developers for this purpose. Negotiations are proceeding for a lease for tourist related purposes of the Old Treatment Works and a site for an orienteering centre has already been defined.

6. PARTICULAR PLANNING CONSIDERATIONS

Much of the proposed road alignment follows existing dirt roads or access ways. The remaining sections traverse vacant blocks and land accommodating temporary uses. There is inadequate road access into and within the area at present for further tourist related sites. By providing a sound ingress point off Cotter Road access to the area will be improved.


ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS

As the proposed roads generally follow existing access ways, there are minimal environmental consequences in upgrading these facilities. Some

tourist sites are to be developed within existing pine plantations, about 10 hectares of which will be reduced to a scattered pine landscape. Pine tree belts will surround these uses. The provision of road and car parking facilities will satisfactorily accommodate the introduced tourist traffic.

TUGGERANONG, POINT HUT ROAD

1. PURPOSE

To modify the existing gazetted boundary to permit the realignment of a section of the road for improved safety and to allow gazettal of the existing picnic area as a public park.

2. LENGTH

The length of road affected is approximately 300 m.

3. COST

The estimated cost of the reconstruction of Point Hut Road between the Tharwa Road and the Point Hut Crossing is \$200.000.

EXISTING DEVELOPMENT

The existing sealed road is deteriorating rapidly as a result of the diversion of heavy vehicles from the Tharwa Bridge which has been subjected to a load limit.

5. PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

It is proposed to reconstruct Point Hut Road between Tharwa Road and Point Hut Crossing on the Murrumbidgee River. This work has become necessary as the road pavement has deteriorated and short term treatment as part of the maintenance programme is no longer economic. The realignment of a section of the road will improve the road geometry and reduce the accident potential.

Adjacent land is under rural use and the proposed new boundaries can be accommodated within the existing fence lines and lease boundaries.

It is also proposed to gazette the existing picnic area as a public park under the Public Parks Ordinance. To do this it is necessary to remove the picnic area from the road reservation as currently gazetted.

6. PARTICULAR PLANNING CONSIDERATIONS

The proposed alignment does not affect long term land use for the areas. The extended road boundaries allow for the inclusion of natural drainage channels within the road reservation which will assist with their effective management.

7. ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS

There are no adverse environmental effects associated with the proposed changes.
