CHAIRMAN'S REVIEW



Hon G F Punch, MP (Chairman)

On behalf of the members of the Committee, I am pleased to present the Committee's annual report for the financial year 1 July 1990 to 30 June 1991. The report continues the practice established in 1976 of informing the Parliament of the Committee's activities and highlighting issues of public administration for discussion and review.

The year was an extremely busy one for the Committee. In total, the Full Committee and its four sectional committees held 111 meetings, spending 285 hours in formal proceedings. Five reports were tabled, including reports on three inquiries; another seven inquiries were in progress.

Once again, the reports tabled covered a broad range of subjects: an investigation of the Parliamentary Information Systems Office (PISO) 'unofficial account' (Report 308), annual reporting guidelines for statutory authorities (Report 309) and the Business Migration Program (Report 310).

The first of these reports concerned the establishment and operation of an illegal account, using the proceeds from the disposal of the Parliament's Honeyweil computing equipment which was said to have become surplus to requirements on the implementation of the computing systems for the new Parliament House. The establishment of this account was found to have resulted from poor management and the lack of effective accountability mechanisms. While the amount of money involved ~ \$88,100 · was small in terms of Commonwealth outlays, the principles involved were significant. The Committee believes that its investigation has proved to be a salutary reminder not only to officers in PISO, but also to all Commonwealth public servants of the responsibilities involved in managing and accounting for the taxpayer's dollar.

Report 309 reflected the Committee's continuing strong interest in annual reporting. In the Committee's view, the annual report lies at the heart of accountability and is one of the most important vehicles for effective Parliamentary scrutiny. The Report presented the first review of the annual reporting guidelines for statutory authorities since their introduction in 1982.

Not surprisingly, the Committee found that the guidelines were out of date and did not adequately reflect the present day administrative environment and the legislative framework within which Commonwealth government entities operate. In its Report, the Committee set the major parameters for drafting new guidelines and proposed a framework for regular review and revision. The recommendations are aimed at ensuring that statutory authorities report meaningfully on both their financial and non-financial performance.

On a related matter, during the year the Committee was again required to approve the guidelines for the preparation of departmental annual reports. These guidelines had been revised in response to the findings and recommendations contained in the Committee's Report 304, Guidelines for Departmental Annual Reports, which was tabled in November 1989. The Committee approved the guidelines, subject to certain changes being made, and they were tabled by the Prime Minister on 10 April 1991. One important change was designed to reflect the recommendation made in Report 304 that the Standing Committees of the House of Representatives be assigned the ongoing role of conducting reviews of departmental operations based on departmental annual reports.

In the Committee's view, the new guidelines represent a significant improvement on those previously used by departments and the examination of annual reports by the Standing Committees of the House of Representatives will enhance the accountability of the Executive Government to the Parliament.

At the close of the year under review, the Committee tabled its report on the Business Migration Program. Severe defects in the administration of the Program led the Committee to recommend its abolition and replacement by a business skills category of entry, with selection based on a points system. These defects centred on inadequate monitoring and the partial privatisation of the migration process through the introduction of the Accredited Agents Scheme. As a result, the Committee concluded that the Program was vulnerable to abuse.

I am pleased to report that the Government responded very promptly to the concerns raised by the Committee, with the Minister for Immigration, Local Government and Ethnic Affairs, the Hon Gerry Hand, MP, announcing on 25 July 1991 the acceptance of the major recommendations contained in Report 310.

Substantial progress was made during the year on the Committee's inquiries into research and development, the social responsibilities of statutory authorities and government business enterprises, and the redevelopment of the Department of Defence's supply computer systems. New inquiries commenced include the Midford Paramount case and related matters, a review of the role and work of the Independent Auditor of the Australian National Audit Office and the Committee's statutory examination of Auditor-General's reports.

In the Committee's last several reports of activities, attention has been drawn to difficulties being experienced in eliciting relevant information from some departments. Over the year, there has been a general improvement in this regard, but the Committee will continue to monitor the situation closely.

On behalf of the Committee, I wish to acknowledge, with great appreciation, the contribution made to its work by members of the Committee secretariat and advisers and secondees to the Committee.

The Committee records its thanks to officers of the Australian National Audit Office and the Department of Finance for their valuable assistance during the year. The excellent service provided by the Principal Parliamentary Reporter and his staff is also acknowledged with much appreciation.

Finally, I wish to thank my Vice-Chairman, Senator John Watson, and all my colleagues on the Committee, including Senator Loosely and Senator Schacht who left during year to take up other Parliamentary responsibilities, for their tireless efforts in furthering the public accountability process.

MEMBERSHIP OF THE SEVENTEENTH JOINT COMMITTEE OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTS

The members of the Seventeenth Committee of the 36th Parliament are shown below. Except where otherwise indicated, members were appointed to the Committee by the Senate on 14 May 1990 and by the House of Representatives on 16 May 1990.

Hon Gary Punch, MP (Chairman)

Gary Punch was elected as Member for Barton in March 1983. He was previously a member of the St George County Council and Sydney County Council, and served as Alderman for the Hurstville Municipal Council from 1977 to 1983. He became Mayor in 1978, a position he retained until he entered Federal Parliament in 1983. Gary Punch was appointed Minister for the Arts and Territories in January 1988, and served until September of the same year. He then accepted the portfolio of Minister for Telecommunications and Aviation Support, which he held until March 1989. Mr Punch is also a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade.

Senator John Watson, BEc, BComm, FCA, FCIS, FAIM (Vice-Chairman)

Elected to the Senate in 1977, Senator Watson has been a member of the Joint Committee of Public Accounts since 1978, and has served as Vice-Chairman since 1986. Senator Watson is a chartered accountant. He is currently serving as Parliamentary Secretary to the Deputy Leader of the Opposition with special responsibilities for taxation. Prior to his election to the Senate, he was general manager of a large textile operation and was also a part-time lecturer in accountancy at the Tasmanian State Institute of Technology and the TAFE College. Senator Watson is Deputy Chairman of the Senate Standing Committee on Finance and Public Administration, and has served on the Senate Estimates Committees.

Ken Aldred was elected as Member for Deakin at the general election in March 1990, having previously been Member for Bruce from 1983-90, and before that Member for Henty from 1975-1980. Actively interested in the areas of economics, industry, defence and immigration, Ken Aldred is currently Chairman of the Opposition Immigration Committee and was formerly Chairman of the Opposition Treasury Committee. He has also been Chairman of the Opposition Defence Committee.

Senator the Hon Terrence Aulich, BA

Terrence Aulich was elected as the Senator for Tasmania in 1984. He was previously elected to the Tasmanian House of Assembly for Wilmot in 1976 and was defeated in 1982. While in the Tasmanian Parliament, Senator Aulich served in a number of State Ministries including Minister for Administrative Services, Industrial Relations and Manpower Planning, Primary Industry, the Environment, Water Resources, Construction, the Arts and Education. Following his election to Federal Parliament, Senator Aulich has served on a number of Senate Standing Committees, chairing the Senate Standing Committee on Employment, Education and Training, and the Joint Select Committee on the Australia Card. He has served on the Senate Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs and Defence, Finance and Government Operations and Senate Estimates Committees. Prior to entering Parliament he taught English in both Australia and England from 1967-71 and was Senior English Master at Latrobe High School in Tasmania from 1972-76. He joined the Public Accounts Committee on 6 March 1991.

Senator Bronwyn Bishop

Before her election to the Senate in 1987 Senator Bishop was a solicitor and company director. She had also held several senior positions in the Liberal Party, including that of President of the New South Wales Division from 1985-1987. Senator Bishop is the former secretary of the Opposition's Business, Industry and Science Policy Committee and has served as the Shadow Minister for Public Administration, Federal Affairs and Local Government. Senator Bishop is a member of the Senate Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade and Senate Estimates Committee A. She is also Deputy Chairman of the Senate Standing Committee on Regulations and Ordinances. Senator Bishop now serves as Chairman of the Coalition's Committee on Trade, Trade Negotiations, Customs and Privatisation as well as Secretary of the Coalition's Economics and Business Taskforce. In addition to these duties, Senator Bishop has recently been appointed Deputy Chairman of the Pacific Democrat Union.

Hon Janice Crosio, MBE, MP

Janice Crosio had extensive government experience in both local and State politics before entering Federal Parliament in March 1990. She served as Alderman, then Deputy Mayor for the Fairfield City Council before being elected the first woman Mayor in 1974. She served four terms as Mayor. Mrs Crosio entered State Parliament in 1981, and in 1984 was elected the first female Minister in the New South Wales Government. She held the posts of Minister for Natural Resources and Minister Assisting the Premier on Women's Interests, Minister for Local Government, Minister for Water Resources and Assistant Minister for Transport. Mrs Crosio is also a member of the House of Representatives Standing Committee on Privileges, and the House of Representatives Standing Community Affairs.

Mr Eric Fitzgibbon, BA, MP

Eric Fitzgibbon, formerly a high school teacher, was elected Member for Hunter in December 1984. An Alderman on the Cessnock City Council for 15 years, Mr Fitzgibbon was Mayor of Cessnock for three years, and served several years as a member of the Hunter Valley and Shortland County Councils, and the East Zone Chairman for the Hospital Association of New South Wales. He is a member of the House of Representatives Standing Committees on Publications and the Library; he is also a member of the Joint Committee on Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade.

Senator Patricia Giles, BA

Senator Giles was elected to the Senate in July 1981. Her career spans nursing, child bearing and rearing, voluntary community activities, graduation as a mature age student, and several years as a trade union official. Senator Giles' Parliamentary work reflects her concern for social justice and the enhancement of the status of women. She holds and has held senior positions in the Senate and Federal ALP, and chairs the Senate Privileges Committee and the Senate Regulations and Ordinances Committee.

Duncan Kerr has degrees in law and social work. He has worked as a Legal Officer for the Hobart Community Legal Service and Principal Solicitor for the Aboriginal Legal Service in New South Wales. He has occupied the positions of Crown Counsel for the Solicitor-General's Department in Tasmania, and Dean of the Faculty of Law in the University of Papua New Guinea. He was elected to the House of Representatives in 1987, and has served on the Joint Select Committee on Corporations Legislation. Mr Kerr is Chairman of the House of Representatives Standing Committee on Aboriginal Affairs and is a member of the House of Representatives Selection Committee and the Standing Committee on Legal and Constitutional Affairs. He also serves on the Joint Committee on Corporations and Securities

Mr John Langmore, MEc (Monash), DipSocStud (Melbourne), MP

John Langmore was elected as Member for Fraser in December 1984. Between 1963 and 1976 he worked in Papua New Guinea as a public servant and university lecturer in economics. From 1976 until his election he was an economics adviser to the Parliamentary Labor Party and for the 18 months prior to 1984, Senior Private Secretary to the Minister for Employment and Industrial Relations. Mr Langmore is Secretary of the Caucus Economics and Industrial Relations Committee, and convenes the Media and Broadcasting Committee. He also chairs the Trade Sub-Committee of the Joint Committee on Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade and the Joint Committee on the Australian Capital Territory. He is a member of the House of Representatives Select Committee on the Print Media.

Senator Stephen Loosley, BA (Hons)

Senator Loosley was elected as Senator for New South Wales in March 1990. Prior to entering Federal Parliament, he was General Secretary of the New South Wales Branch of the ALP. Senator Loosley is a member of the Senate Standing Committees on Environment, Recreation and the Arts; Finance and Public Administration; and Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade. He is also a member of the Joint Committee on the National Crime Authority and the Senate Select Committee on Community Standards Relevant to the Supply of Services Utilising Telecommunications Technologies. Senator Loosley is Chairman of both the ALP International Committee and the ALP External Relations Committee. He also held the office of Senior National Vice President of the ALP prior to being elected President in June 1991. Senator Loosley was a member of the Public Accounts Committee from 24 August 1990 to 6 March 1991.

Mr Garry Barr Nehl, MP

Garry Nehl was elected Member for the seat of Cowper on the mid north coast of New South Wales in December 1984. He is Deputy Chairman of Committees in the House of Representatives and Deputy Whip of the National Party. He has served on several House of Representatives Standing Committees including: Industry, Science and Technology; Publications; Selection; Long Term Strategies; and Legal and Constitutional Affairs. He has also served on the Joint Committee on Poreign Affairs, Defence and Trade. Mr Nehl is actively interested in the areas of welfare, defence, foreign affairs, the aged and transportation. He also is the convenor of the Australian Parliamentary Antarctic Alliance.

Senator the Hon Margaret Revnolds, DipSpEd, BA

Senator Reynolds was a teacher and lecturer in Tasmania, Britain and Queensland before being elected to the Senate in 1983. She became Minister for Local Government in 1987 and Minister Assisting the Prime Minister on the Status of Women in 1988, holding both positions until April 1990. Senator Reynolds previously served on the Public Accounts Committee (1983-85), the Senate Standing Committee on Finance and Government Operations (1984-87), the Senate Standing Committee on Education and chaired Senate Estimates Committees D and F. Senator Reynolds is currently Chairperson of the Senate Select Committee on Community Standards Relevant to the Supply of Services Utilising Telecommunications Technologies and serves on Senate Estimates Committee C, the Senate Standing Committee on Community Affairs, the Joint House Committee and the Senate Publications Committee.

Senator Christopher Schacht, DipT

Prior to entering the Senate, Senator Schacht served as Press Secretary to the South Australian State Minister for Agriculture, and then as Principal Private Secretary to the Post-Master General. During this period, he was also State Organiser, then State Secretary for the South Australian branch of the Australian Labor Party. Elected in 1987, Senator Schacht has had a long interest in foreign affairs and related issues and he Chairs the Joint Committee on Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade as a member of the Senate Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade. Senator Schacht is also a member of the Senate Standing Committee on Transport, Communications and Infrastructure, the Senate Standing Committee on Legal and Constitutional Affairs, and Senate Estimates Committee B. Senator Schacht was a member of the Public Accounts Committee from 14 May 1990 to 24 August 1990.

Les Scott was elected as the Member for Oxley at a by-election in October 1988. Prior to entering Parliament he had worked in the banking industry for twenty five years. During his banking career Mr Scott also took an active role in the Australian Bank Employees Union and was Queensland State President and Federal Vice President of the Union at the time of his election. He is a member of the House of Representatives Standing Committees on Aboriginal Affairs and Industry, Science and Technology and of the Joint Committee on Broadcasting of Parliamentary Proceedings. Mr Scott is also serving on the House of Representatives Standing Committee on Finance and Public Administration during consideration of the inquiry into the Australian banking industry.

Mr Peter Shack, BA (Hons), MP

Peter Shack was first elected as the Member for Tangney in 1977, but lost the seat in 1983. He was re-elected in 1984, and has held the seat in subsequent elections. Prior to entering Parliament, Mr Shack was a company director and political adviser. He has served in the Opposition Shadow Ministry as Spokesman on Employment, Industrial Relations and Youth Affairs; Education and Youth Affairs; Employment, Training and Youth Affairs; and Health. He has served on the House of Representatives Standing Committees on Standing Orders and on Road Safety, and the Joint Standing Committee on Electoral Matters. He is also Deputy Chairman of the House of Representatives Standing Committee on Procedure and is a member of the House of Representatives Select Committee on the Print Media.

Mr Alexander Somlyav, BEc, JP, MP

Alex Somlyay was elected as Member for Fairfax in March 1990. Prior to entering Parliament, he worked as a public servant before becoming a consultant economist and company director. He was appointed as Senior Private Secretary to the Hon A E Adermann, who was Minister for the Northern Territory, and Minister Assisting the Minister for National Resources from 1975 to 1978, and later Minister for Veteran's Affairs and Minister Assisting the Minister for Primary Industries from 1978 to 1980. Mr Somlyay is also serving on the House of Representatives Standing Committee on Finance and Public Administration during the consideration of the inquiry into the Australian banking industry. He is a member of the House of Representatives Select Committee on the Print Media. Mr Somlyay is Chairman of the Opposition Tourism and Aviation Committee and has acted as Shadow Minister for Land Transport and Deputy Opposition Whip.

Chapter 1

THE COMMITTEE

Background

- 1.1 The first Commonwealth Joint Committee of Public Accounts was established in 1913, and was re-appointed in successive Parliaments until 1932, when it was suspended as an 'economy measure'. The Committee was re-established by the Public Accounts Committee Act 1951, which sets out its powers, functions and method of operation. As such, it is one of five statutory committees of the Parliament.
- 1.2 The present Committee is the seventeenth appointed since 1952. Its purpose is to ensure the accountability of the public sector to the Parliament and it does this by scrutinising the moneys expended by, and the efficiency of, Commonwealth government departments and agencies.

Membership

- 1.3 The Committee has 15 members, five of whom are appointed by the Senate and 10 by the House of Representatives. Both Government and Opposition members are represented on the Committee and it is accepted practice that the majority of members be from the Government Party. By tradition, the Committee's Chairman is a Government member elected by the whole Committee, while the Vice-Chairman is elected from the Opposition members. As a standing committee of the Parliament, Committee members continue to hold office (subject to certain qualifications) until the end of the Parliament by which they were appointed.
- 1.4 The Committee has always adopted a bipartisan approach to its work and is proud of the fact that since the appointment of the first Committee in 1952, with one exception, its reports to the Parliament have been unanimous.

Independence

- 1.5 The Public Accounts Committee Act 1951 gives the Committee the right to operate with absolute independence. This power derives principally from Sections 6A(1) and 8(1)(b) of the Act which read:
 - 6A(1) The Committee may meet at such times and at such places within Australia as the Committee, by resolution, determines or, subject to any resolution of the Committee, as the Chairman determines ...
 - 8(1)(b) ... to report to both Houses of the Parliament, with such comment as it thinks fit, any items or matters in those accounts, statements and reports, or any circumstances connected with them, to which the Committee is of the opinion that the attention of the Parliament should be directed.

Functions

- 1.6 Section 8(1) of the Public Accounts Committee Act 1951 sets out the Committee's main duties. Section 8(1)(b) of the Act, quoted above, gives the Committee the power to determine the areas of government administration it may wish to investigate. In addition, it is required to examine:
 - the accounts of the receipts and expenditure of the Commonwealth;
 - the financial affairs of Commonwealth authorities and intergovernmental bodies; and
 - all reports of the Auditor-General, including his efficiency audit reports.
- 1.7 It also reports on any alterations it thinks desirable in the form of public accounts, the method of keeping them, or in the mode of receipt, control, issue or payment of public moneys.

1.8 Under section 25 of the *Public Service Act 1922* the Committee is responsible for approving the guidelines for departmental annual reports; other duties are assigned to the Committee by Commonwealth legislation on statutory marketing authorities.

Mode of Operation

- 1.9 The usual practice is for the Committee to determine its own work program and inquiries. Either House of Parliament may also refer any question in connection with the public accounts for inquiry and report and other duties may be assigned to the Committee by Joint Standing Orders approved by both Houses of Parliament.
- 1.10 Through the use of sectional committees (sub-committees), the Committee is able to undertake a number of inquiries concurrently. In 1990-91, there were four sectional committees in operation.
- I.11 Inquiries are generally advertised in the national press. In addition, relevant individuals and organisations are invited to make written submissions. These submissions form the basis of evidence and facilitate questioning at the Committee's public hearings. Where secret or confidential matters are being considered, the Committee's Act provides for evidence to be taken in camera. Observers from the Australian National Audit Office and the Department of Finance assist the Committee at its public hearings by providing expert advice on the matters under discussion.
- 1.12 The Committee is supported by a full-time secretariat, which provides procedural, research and administrative assistance. Specialist advisers and consultants, from both the public and private sectors, provide technical advice to the Committee as the need arises. The Committee also has a policy of accepting officers on secondment from Commonwealth departments and agencies. Of particular importance is the regular secondment of officers from the Australian National Audit Office and the Department of Finance, as both these organisations have a long-standing and close relationship with the Committee.

Chapter 2

REPORTS PRESENTED

- 2.1 In 1990-91 the Committee tabled five reports, Reports 306-310. These were:
 - . Report 306 Finance Minutes
 - . Report 307 Activities 1989-90
 - . Report 308 The Parliamentary Information Office (PISO) 'Unofficial Account'
 - . Report 309 Annual Reporting Guidelines for Statutory Authorities
 - . Report 310 Business Migration Program
- 2.2 An overview of each report, together with a summary of the Committee's main findings and recommendations where relevant, is presented.

Report 306 - Finance Minutes

- 2.3 Report 306 is a consolidated volume of Department of Finance Minutes received and tabled by the Committee in 1990.
- 2.4 The Department of Finance Minute is the formal presentation of the Government's response to a Committee report. Under this system the Minister for Finance refers a report to the responsible Minister(s) as soon as it is tabled. In addition, the Department of Finance refer the report to the appropriate departmental secretaries and co-ordinates the preparation of responses to the Committee. Responses are usually provided within six months of the tabling of each Committee report.
- 2.5 Under revised procedures adopted in 1989, the Committee tables each Finance Minute in Parliament as soon as practicable after its receipt, with additional comment if necessary. In addition, the Committee publishes annually, in one volume, all the Finance Minutes received in that calendar year, once again with comment as required.

- 2.6 The tabling of a Finance Minute does not mark the end of the Committee's scrutiny of the matters contained in the Minute, as the Committee has reserved the right to conduct a detailed analysis subsequent to tabling. Where it is warranted, the Committee may undertake a further formal inquiry into the matters dealt with in the initial report and the corresponding Finance Minute.
- 2.7 In those cases where a Government response on policy matters is required, this is tabled separately from the Finance Minute and within the timeframe applying to Government responses to other Committee's reports, that is, three months from the date of tabling.
- 2.6 Report 306 contains the Finance Minutes relating to the following Committee reports:

- 2.9 The Report also contains the response of the Minister for Finance to the two recommendations contained in the Committee's 1989 report on Finance Minutes Report 309. The first of these recommendations was that departmental responses to Committee reports be prepared, oversighted and signed at the Secretary level. This was rejected by the Government, on the basis that the appropriate level of clearance is a matter for it to decide
- 2.10 The second recommendation that the Government's response to Committee recommendations on matters of policy be tabled separately from the Finance Minute within the timeframe applying to Government responses to other Committee's reports was supported.

Report 307 - Activities 1989-90

2.11 Report 307 covers the activities of the Committee for the 1989-90 financial year. This was the first year of operation for the Seventeenth Committee with the Hon Gary Punch, MP, as its Chairman.

Report 308 - The Parliamentary Information Systems Office (PISO) 'Unofficial Account'

- 2.12 Report 308 presents the findings of the Committee's Inquiry into the Parliamentary Information Systems Office (PISO) 'Unofficial Account'. The Inquiry was referred to the Sixteenth Committee by the Senate on 29 November 1989, following a recommendation made by Senate Estimates Committee A in its 1989 Report to the Senate. The Seventeenth Committee resumed the Inquiry in May 1990.
- 2.13 This so-called 'unofficial account' was set up with the proceeds some \$88,100 from the disposal of the Parliament's Honeywell computing equipment which was said to have become surplus to requirements on the implementation of the computing systems for the new Parliament House. The Committee's task was to examine the roles and responsibilities of the key players in the establishment and operation of the 'unofficial account' and to assess what further action was required in response to the breaches identified in the report of the Auditor-General, who had previously examined this matter.
- 2.14 The Committee found that the 'unofficial account' was clearly illegal. It concluded that poor management and the lack of effective accountability mechanisms in a situation of devolved responsibility created the environment which enabled the 'unofficial account' to be set up in the first place and remain undetected for so long. For example, at the time of the events under review, there was no internal audit function within the Department of the Parliamentary Library nor, indeed, in any of the Parliamentary Departments. The Committee did note, however, that since the transfer of PISO from the Department of the Parliamentary Library to the Department of the Parliamentary Reporting Staff in February 1990 substantial measures had been taken to improve the management and accountability of PISO.

- 2.15 Eight recommendations, the majority of a systemic nature, were made in the Report, including that:
 - each Parliamentary Department which had not already done so should establish, as a matter of priority, an adequately resourced internal audit function;
 - all new entrants to the Australian Public Service be briefed on the financial legal framework affecting public servant's dealings with Commonwealth financial resources;
 - the Commonwealth Government examine ways to ensure that its major contractors comply with relevant Commonwealth legislation and operating policies which impinge on contracts; and
 - the Department of Administrative Services review the guidelines and procedures regarding the disposal of surplus, unserviceable or obsolete assets to ensure that the arrangements in place are adequate, clearly understood and properly implemented.
- 2.16 The Committee's findings in relation to its specific terms of reference are summarised in Chapter 8 of the Report, which notes that the matter of possible disciplinary action against those involved in the 'unofficial account' is for the relevant delegates under the *Public Service Act 1922* to determine.
- 2.17 The Report also highlights the fact that, although the Inquiry into the unofficial account' was concerned with issues of accountability, in keeping with the Committee's charter, it differed significantly from the Committee's usual inquiries in that the terms of reference called for an assessment of specific individuals' roles and responsibilities. While its evidence is taken on oath or affirmation, the Committee is not a court of law. It is, however, mindful of due process and at all times during the Inquiry the Committee attempted to ensure that the principles of natural justice prevailed.

Report 309 - Annual Reporting Guidelines for Statutory Authorities

- 2.18 The Committee has had a long standing interest in annual reporting, stemming from its belief that the annual report lies at the heart of the accountability process and is one of the most important vehicles for effective Parliamentary scrutiny. Prior to Report 309, the Committee had reported on a number of aspects of annual reporting by departments, however this was its first report focussing on statutory authorities.
- 2.19 The present <u>Guidelines for the Content, Preparation and Presentation of Annual Reports by Statutory Authorities</u> were issued by the Government in November 1982. Since that time, the guidelines have been neither updated nor reissued. Not surprisingly, the Committee found that the guidelines are out of date and do not adequately reflect the changes that have taken place in both the present day administrative environment and the legislative framework within which Commonwealth government entities operate.
- 2.20 Statutory authorities have generally been afforded more management autonomy and flexibility in financial administration than departments of state. This is particularly the case in the light of the ongoing reforms to public sector management and since the issue of the Government's <u>Policy Guidelines for Commonwealth Statutory Authorities and Government Business Enterprises</u> in October 1987. In the Committee's view, however, this increased autonomy and flexibility give rise to an even greater need for detailed and proper reporting by statutory authorities for their performance to fulfil their accountability requirements to Parliament and through Parliament to the public at large.
- 2.21 It was against this background that the Committee, in Report 309, endeavoured to set the major parameters for the drafting of new guidelines for annual reporting by statutory authorities. The recommendations in the Report are intended to lay the foundation for statutory authorities to prepare high quality annual reports that focus on the meaningful reporting of both financial and non-financial performance. While the Report does not address all detailed issues in annual reporting, it identifies the critical matters that should be included in annual reports.
- 2.22 In Report 309, the Committee recommended that new guidelines be prepared by the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet, with that Department also responsible for an annual update and review of the guidelines. Furthermore, the Committee recommended that the guidelines be given statutory backing and, in line with the current practice for the guidelines for departmental annual reports, be approved by the Joint Committee of Public Accounts.

- 2.23 There is a vast array of bodies that can be classified as statutory authorities and as part of its Inquiry, the Committee closely examined the classes of statutory authorities to which the annual reporting guidelines should apply. The Committee recommended that there should be one set of guidelines, clearly stating the categories of statutory authorities to which they apply. The Committee further recommended that these categories should include government business enterprises, statutory marketing authorities, other commercial statutory authorities and non-commercial statutory authorities.
- 2.24 The Committee found that the 1982 guidelines do not adequately emphasise the importance of results-oriented reporting. It recommended, therefore, that all statutory authorities be required to report on non-financial performance in their annual reports, providing, as a minimum, an outline of program objectives and desired results, together with a description of key performance indicators. Comparative data over successive years should be presented where relevant.
- 2.25 Report 309 pays particular attention to the situation of statutory authorities with commercial operations. With the aim of improving the quality and timeliness of information to Parliament, the Committee recommended that such authorities be required to present to the relevant Minister, on a half-yearly basis, interim reports on financial position. Furthermore, all statutory authorities should be required to report to the relevant Minister critical events which have a material effect on financial position as they occur. In the formulation of the new annual reporting guidelines, the Committee also recommended that stronger consideration be given to the treatment and disclosure in annual reports of commercially sensitive information.
- 2.26 Finally, the Committee made a number of specific recommendations to bring about enhanced scrutiny by Parliament of the annual reports of statutory authorities.

Report 310 - Business Migration Program

2.27 Report 310 is the first report of the Committee's Inquiry into the Business Migration Program and Control of Visitor Entry. Following the announcement of the Inquiry in June 1990, the Committee received 52 submissions, the majority of which concerned the Business Migration Program.

- 2.28 In view of this response, the Committee decided in February 1991 to report first on the Business Migration Program before examining issues arising from the terms of reference dealing with the Control of Visitor Entry. Report 310 was tabled in the House of Representatives and the Senate on 21 June 1991.
- 2.29 The major findings of the Committee were that the administration of Business Migration Program contained a number of deficiencies which centred on inadequate monitoring and the use of private sector accredited migration agents, which made the Program vulnerable to abuse.
- 2.30 The lack of monitoring made any assessment of the achievement of Program objectives difficult, simply because the data was unavailable.
- 2.31 The Committee was concerned about the operation of the Accredited Agent Scheme, where it found a number of basic flaws in both the Scheme's conception and execution. The flaws identified by the Committee were:
 - although having delegated authority by the Commonwealth to assess migration applications, accredited agents are not responsible to the Commonwealth but are acting as agents for their clients:
 - the speed with which the Scheme was introduced resulted in a large number of accredited agents, with varying degrees of experience, into migration consultancy. This resulted in the Department of Immigration, Local Government and Ethnic Affairs' control of the Scheme, and ultimately the Business Migration Program, being reduced;
 - the number of accredited agents and the relatively small client base resulted in accredited agents being under pressure to survive financially; and
 - the involvement of foreign based sub-agents, outside the control of the Department, being in a position to exploit the financial vulnerability of accredited agents.

- 2.32 Against this background, the Committee recommended the abolition of the Accredited Agent Scheme effectively abolishing the Business Migration Program. The Committee noted that while there was an ongoing role for the private sector to provide assistance to potential migrants, the total responsibility for assessing migration applications should remain clearly with the Department of Immigration.
- 2.33 The Committee believed, however, that it was important for Australia's migration program to continue to have an element with a sharp economic focus. The Committee therefore recommended that a business skills category of migration be introduced, with:
 - . the assessment of business skills as the major criterion of entry; and
 - points being allocated for age, English language ability and the transfer of capital.
- 2.34 The Committee recommended that the primary objective of this category of entry be the establishment of business in Australia.
- 2.35 An improved monitoring system was also recommended, with mandatory compliance for migrants coming to Australian under the new business skills category and with failure to comply attracting a financial penalty.
- 2.36 A major focus of media attention during the Inquiry was the issue of criminal involvement in the Business Migration Program. From the information available to it, however, the Committee concluded that the Program had not been the subject of large scale assault by organised criminal groups and that only in a limited number of instances had there been penetration of the Program by identified criminal figures.

Chapter 3

INQUIRIES IN PROGRESS

This Chapter provides a brief description of the Inquiries being conducted by the Committee as at 30 June 1991. An account is given of the status of each inquiry, together with an overview of the issues which have arisen thus far.

Research and Development

- 3.1 In recent years, a number of developments have combined to arouse an unprecedented level of public debate over the funding and conduct of the national research effort. Questions have been raised as to whether its current structure, and particularly the predominance of large public sector research organisations, is conducive to the efficient and cost-effective achievement of national objectives.
- 3.2 Changes to funding arrangements aimed at targeting research expenditure more closely to national goals and increasing the industry relevance of public sector research have been greeted with considerable concern by the science community.
- 3.3 In response to this concern, the Sixteenth Committee commenced an Inquiry into Public Sector Research in October 1989. The Committee also viewed the Inquiry as an opportunity to monitor the progress made by a number of research organisations in the implementation of recommendations of the Auditor-General and several external committees of review.
- 3.4 The terms of reference for the Inquiry were to review publicly performed research and development, excluding that performed by tertiary education institutions, with particular reference to:
 - its contribution to Australian development;
 - the adequacy of current funding levels; and
 - the cost-effectiveness and efficiency of the use of those funds,

- 3.5 Following the 1990 Federal Election, the Inquiry was recommenced by the Seventeenth Committee under expanded terms of reference and with the new title, "Inquiry into Research and Development". The Inquiry now encompasses not only those issues mentioned above, but also the concomitant question of Commonwealth support for private sector investment in research and development.
- 3.6 Whilst the terms of reference for the Inquiry fall squarely within the ambit of the Committee's responsibilities, the subject matter of the Inquiry has necessitated consideration of an unusually broad, extensive and complex set of issues and government programs.
- 3.7 The extension of the terms of reference for the Inquiry was prompted by the Committee's recognition that the application of new technology and the successful commercialisation of R & D by more Australian firms are crucial if we are to improve our balance of trade, create more employment and strengthen our economic base.
- 3.8 Furthermore, it has become apparent to the Committee that the adequacy of research funding and the rate of return to the taxpayer from public research expenditure are strongly linked to the willingness of Australian industry to invest in R & D, and by its capacity to translate those investments into commercial successes.
- 3.9 A meaningful of review of the funding, cost effectiveness and efficiency of public sector research organisations requires close attention to the inter-relationship between those organisations and industry. It must also take account of those factors which affect private sector investment decisions and the successful commercialisation of technology.
- 3.10 The Inquiry has attracted 103 submissions from a wide range of individuals and organisations. An extensive series of public hearings and inspections were held between August 1990 and May 1991 and it is expected that the Committee will report during the 1991 Budget sittings of Parliament.

Midford Paramount Case and Related Matters

3.11 This Inquiry was referred to the Committee by the Senate on 5 December 1990.

- 3.12 The Inquiry arose following the withdrawal by the Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP) of Crimes Act charges against the shirt importer and manufacturer, Midford Paramount Pty Ltd. The Directors of Midford Paramount and a consultant had been charged with conspiring to defraud the Commonwealth of approximately \$4.5 million in Customs duties.
- 3.13 The terms of reference from the Senate require the Committee to inquire and report on the following matters:
 - (a) the cost to the Commonwealth, amounting to more than \$1m, of the actions of the Department of Industry, Technology and Commerce and the Australian Customs Service in fulfilling their administrative responsibilities in the handling of the failed prosecution of Midford Paramount Pty Ltd;
 - (b) the methods of operation of the Australian Customs Service in preparation and conduct of prosecutions and settlements and, in particular, their actions throughout the preparation, prosecution and settlement of the Midford Paramount Pty Ltd case, including the reasons for the Director of Public Prosecutions' discontinuance of the prosecution:
 - (c) the practice, propriety and method of the Australian Customs Service of gathering evidence for prosecutions and dealing with the public in the course of such investigations:
 - (d) the actions of the Minister for Industry, Technology and Commerce and successive Ministers responsible for Customs in addressing the propriety of administrative actions within the Industry, Technology and Commerce portfolio and the Australian Customs Service, in particular; and
 - (e) the need for effective definition of the lines of ministerial control of the Australian Customs Service and, in particular, the actions of the Minister for Industry, Technology and Commerce in oversighting successive Ministers responsible for Customs in relation to the operations of the Australian Customs Service.

3.14 Up to the end of June 1991 the Committee received 22 public submissions and a number of confidential submissions. In March 1991, the DPP requested that the Committee not proceed with its scheduled public hearings because he felt that the reporting of the hearings by the media could prejudice the fair trail of another matter before the courts at that time. After considering a number of matters, including the sub judice convention, the Committee decided not to hold public hearings until the case referred to by the DPP had been resolved. The Senate subsequently granted an extension of the reporting date for this Inquiry from 15 May to 7 November 1991.

Business Migration Program and Control of Visitor Entry

- 3.15 As indicated on page 10 of this Report, the Committee began its Inquiry into the Business Migration Program and the Control of Visitor Entry in June 1990. The Committee has received submissions from government departments and employees, State and Federal police agencies, industry associations and private individuals. The majority of these submissions concerned the Business Migration Program.
- 3.16 In view of this, the Committee decided in February 1991 firstly report on the Business Migration Program before to examining the Control of Visitor Entry. The Committee's first report on the Business Migration Program was tabled in both Houses of Parliament on 21 June 1991.
- 3.17 Some of the major issues to be dealt with while examining the Control of Visitor Entry aspects of the Inquiry are:
 - . the adequacy of Departmental policy and procedures relating to the Migrant Alert List; and
 - the adequacy of the Department's extensive computerisation program, especially as it relates to the Entry Operations Centre and monitoring of overstayed visitors.
- 3.18 The Committee will be conducting hearings in the second half of 1991, and expects its report to be tabled in Parliament towards the end of the Budget Sittings 1991.

The Social Responsibilities of Commonwealth Statutory Authorities and Government Business Enterprises

- 3.19 This Inquiry was commenced in September 1989 by the Sixteenth Committee and was resumed by the Seventeenth Committee in June 1990. It focuses on the measurement and reporting of the performance of the social responsibilities of Commonwealth statutory authorities and government business enterprises, and complements the Committee's Inquiry into the Annual Reporting Guidelines for Statutory Authorities, the report which was tabled in May 1991.
- 3.20 To date the Committee has received 66 submissions. In 1990-91 the Committee made two inspections, received three briefings and held five public hearings.
- 3.21 One of the first tasks of the Committee was to more clearly define the term, 'social responsibilities'. Broadly speaking social responsibilities are those activities which:
 - . may not have purely financial implications:
 - may be community service obligations required of certain government bodies;
 - may be required of government entities and would not normally be imposed on or required of a purely commercial entity in a similar enterprise;
 - . may be perceived social objectives incorporated in the organisation's corporate plan;
 - . may have been adopted voluntarily by an organisation; or
 - may be other activities which are considered by government entities as social responsibilities.
- 3.22 Social responsibility activities also cover a wide spectrum including the environment, energy, fair business practices, products, service provision, human resources and community involvement. In short social responsibilities can be characterised as providing a degree of protection to the vulnerable and ensuring the proper use of resources.

- 3.23 The Committee also established at an early stage that social responsibilities differ in their impact on the work of statutory authorities from one type of authority to another. Some of the budget-dependent statutory authorities, in their submissions to the Inquiry, claimed that the whole reason for their existence was to perform certain social responsibilities that the Government had seen fit to undertake. Running libraries, art galleries and museums are examples of such social responsibilities. For the commercially-oriented statutory authority on the other hand, the main focus of attention is obviously on their commercial operations and their social responsibilities are considerations that inform the manner in which they carry out their business.
- 3.24 During the Inquiry, the Committee has been examining the methods available for measuring equal employment, industrial democracy and occupational health and safety program, actions with environmental impacts in terms of energy use and major physical developments and community input into the operations of statutory authorities and government business enterprises.
- 3.25 It expects to report on the outcome of the Inquiry early in the 1991 Budget Session of the Parliament.

Department of Defence Computer Redevelopment Program

- 3.26 The Committee's Inquiry into the Department of Defence's Supply Systems Redevelopment Project (SSRP) is a continuation of an Inquiry begun by the Sixteenth Joint Committee of Public Accounts in the 35th Parliament.
- 3.27 On 27 September 1988 the Senate referred to the Sixteenth Committee a number of questions relating to management and administration of SSRP. The Committee was unable to complete its examination by the end of the 35th Parliament and the Inquiry was therefore recommenced by the Seventeenth Committee following its appointment after the March 1990 Federal Election.
- 3.28 The examination of SSRP by the Sixteenth Committee covered matters relating to both SSRP and Defence's Project DESINE. Project DESINE is a program to standardise the Department's computing environment by progressively replacing most of the existing computer equipment with new equipment supplied by the DESINE prime contractor, IBM. SSRP, as well as being a major applications system is a vehicle to introduce DESINE.

- 3.29 While the Inquiry is concerned with the management and administration of SSRP and the cost-benefits of the Project, a significant amount of time has been spent on other related issues such as the DESINE Contract. More recently, the Committee's interest has focussed on the Prime Systems Integrator for SSRP.
- 3.30 The Committee has held numerous public hearings and conducted several inspections of Defence facilities as part of its Inquiry and hopes to table a report early in the 1991 Budget Sittings.

Review of the Independent Auditor

- 3.31 In June 1991, the Committee commenced a review of the Independent Auditor of the Australian National Audit Office. The Independent Auditor is appointed under the Audit Act 1901 to carry out audits of the Australian National Audit Office's accounts, records and financial statements, as well as efficiency audits of its operations. Since the establishment of the position in 1979, two Independent Auditors have been appointed, both from the private sector.
- 3.32 The Committee's review is a broad-ranging one, focussing on the role and work of the Independent Auditor. In addition to advertising the review nationally, the Committee has sought submissions from interested parties, including the major accounting firms and auditors-general in each of the States and Territories, as well as those in comparable countries overseas. A report on the review is expected to be tabled in the 1991 Budget Sittings.

Review of Auditor-General's Reports

3.33 One of the statutory duties of the Committee is to examine all reports of the Auditor-General, including efficiency audit reports. Since the establishment in 1987 of the comprehensive system of general purpose standing committees of the House of Representatives, efficiency audit reports have often been referred to the relevant committee for examination. Where these reports have not been referred to another committee, the Public Accounts Committee has continued its traditional scrutiny role.

3.34 Against this background, in 1990-91 the Committee commenced an examination of the following Auditor-General's reports:

Chapter 4

OTHER ACTIVITIES OF THE COMMITTEE

4.1 In addition to its inquiry workload, the Committee engaged in a number of other activities during the year. This Chapter gives a brief overview of those activities.

Approval of Departmental Annual Report Guidelines

- 4.2 During the year the Committee was again required to approve guidelines for departmental annual reports. This requirement comes from the Public Service Act 1922.
- 4.3 Sub-section 25(6) of the *Public Service Act 1922* requires that the secretary of a department prepare and furnish to the Minister administering the department an annual report on the department for the year ended 30 June.
- 4.4 Sub-section 25(7) provides that reports prepared under sub-section 25(6) shall be in accordance with the guidelines from time to time presented to the Parliament by the Prime Minister after approval by the Joint Committee of Public Accounts.
- 4.5 On 8 March 1991 the Prime Minister wrote to the Chairman of the Committee attaching proposed new guidelines for approval by the Committee. Having considered the proposed guidelines, the Committee agreed to their approval subject to certain changes being made. One important change was that the guidelines refer to Recommendation 2 of Report 304 and state that the standing committees of the House of Representatives are assigned the ongoing role of conducting reviews of departmental operations. Report 304, tabled in November 1989, set out the Committee's views on annual report guidelines for Commonwealth departments and was the catalyst for the new guidelines.
- 4.6 In September 1989 the Committee conducted an inquiry into the guidelines applying to departmental annual reports, with a view to determining the extent and nature of any revision to the guidelines which may have been required. The Committee's Report 304 was tabled in November 1989.

4.7 The Prime Minister agreed to the Committee's changes and the new guidelines were tabled in the House of Representatives on 10 April 1991. The guidelines state:

The [Committee], in its Report 304, has recommended that the standing committees of the House of Representatives be assigned the ongoing role of conducting reviews of departmental operations based upon the annual reports of departments. A motion will be moved in the House to give effect to this recommendation.

- 4.8 The Committee anticipates that a motion to give effect to its recommendation will be moved in the House of Representatives during the 1991 Budget Sittings.
- 4.9 The Committee believes the guidelines are a significant improvement on those previously used by Commonwealth departments and that the examination of annual reports by standing committees of the House of Representatives will do much to enhance the accountability of executive government to the Parliament.

Conferences and Seminars

4.10 Throughout the year, the Chairman and other members of the Committee received numerous requests to speak on the role and work of the Committee, current inquiries and matters related to the work of the Committee. Where possible these requests were accepted. Some of the speaking engagements are listed below.

Asset Management

4.11 On 16 July 1990 the Chairman gave the opening address to a Conference on Public Sector Management which was organised by the Royal Australian Institute of Public Administration.

Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet. <u>Quidelines for the preparation of departmental annual reports</u>, April 1991, para. 1.10.

Accountability: Past, Present and Future

- 4.13 On 28 August 1990 the Vice-Chairman, Senator Watson, spoke at a five-day conference held in Canberra on Public Sector Performance. The topic of his speech was 'Accountability: past, present and future'.
- 4.14 The speech provided an opportunity to explore numerous accountability issues and to participate in what is an ongoing debate about the shape and form of accountability in today's changing public sector. Senator Watson sought to give attendees an understanding of accountability from the Committee's perspective and encouraged them to think critically about the reforms that have occurred and to participate in the accountability debate.

Annual Reporting Guidelines

4.15 On 30 April 1991 the Chairman spoke at a Public Sector Accounting Conference held in Sydney. His speech dealt with issues arising from the then current Inquiry into the Annual Reporting Guidelines for Statutory Authorities and the Inquiry into the Social Responsibilities of Commonwealth Statutory Authorities and Government Business Enterprises.

Auditing for Public Accountability

- 4.16 In May this year the Queensland Electoral and Administrative Review Commission held a two-day seminar on the general theme of Auditing for Public Accountability.
- 4.17 The Vice-Chairman, Senator Watson, spoke at the seminar on the relationship between the Commonwealth Auditor-General and parliamentary committees. In his speech, Senator Watson drew upon the findings contained in the Committee's Report No. 296, The Auditor-General, Ally of the People and the Parliament.

Visitors

- 4.18 During the year the Committee met with several visiting individuals and groups. The meetings provided an opportunity for all concerned to learn and to exchange views on issues of mutual interest. Visitors included:
 - . a delegation from the Indonesian State Audit Board:
 - the New Zealand Minister of Regional Development and Associate Minister of Immigration and Employment, the Hon Roger Maxwell, MP:
 - a delegation from the Parliament of Western Samoa led by the Speaker, the Hon A'Eau Penuiamina Leavaiseeta, MP:
 - representatives of the Australian Accounting Research Foundation Legislation Review Board;
 - Congressman Gary Teves from the Philippines Congress;
 - Mr Brian Waldron, National President of the Australian Society of Certified Practising Accountants and other members of the Society; and
 - members of the National Accountants in Government Committee of the Australian Society of Certified Practising Accountants.

Seventh Biennial Conference of Public Accounts Committees

- 4.19 The Seventh Biennial Conference of Public Accounts Committees was held in Darwin in May 1991. The Committee was represented at the conference by the Vice-Chairman, Senator Watson, Senator Bromwyn Bishop and Mr Eric Fitzgibbon, MP. The Secretary and Deputy Secretary of the Committee also attended.
- 4.20 The Conference provides a forum for members and secretariat staff of the Commonwealth, State and Territory Public Accounts Committees to exchange ideas and report on their activities of the previous two years. Representatives of the New Zealand, Papua New Guinea and Canadian Public Accounts Committees were also present at the Conference and provided an international perspective on the issues under discussion.

- 4.21 On behalf of the Committee, Senator Watson made a joint presentation with Mr James Guthrie of the University of New South Wales entitled "The Adoption of Corporate Forms of Government Undertakings: Accountability Issues for the 1990s"
- 4.22 Senator Watson focussed on the work the Committee has been undertaking in this area through its Inquiry into Annual Reporting Guidelines for Statutory Authorities and the Inquiry into the Social Responsibilities of Commonwealth Statutory Authorities and Government Business Enterprises. In addition, the following major papers were presented:
 - . "Public Accounts Committees A Bureaucrat's Perspective", by Mr David Shand, Commissioner, Public Sector Management Commission, Queensland;
 - . "Annual Reporting and the Parliament", by Mr Nick Catania, MLA, Chairman of the Public Accounts Committee of Western Australia:
 - . "The Format of the Public Accounts", by Mr Kevin Hamilton, MLA, Chairman of the Public Accounts Committee of South Australia;
 - "Auditing in the Aftermath of the Fitzgerald Commission of Inquiry", by Mr Ches Baragwanath, Auditor-General for Victoria:
 - "An Overview of the Public Accountability Process in Canada with a special emphasis on Canadian Public Accounts Committees: What they have in common, major differences and proposed reforms", by Mr Barry Pashak, MLA, Chairman of the Standing Committee on Public Accounts, Alberta, Canada; and
 - "The Relationship between Public Accounts Committees and Auditors-General", by the Hon Theo Theophanous, MLC, Chairperson of the Victorian Economic and Budget Review Committee.
- 4.23 The Annual General Meeting of the Australasian Council of Public Accounts Committees, which was formed in 1989 to facilitate regular interaction between the committees, was held during a break in conference proceedings.

Chapter 5

ISSUES ARISING FROM THE COMMITTEE'S ACTIVITIES.

5.1 This Chapter highlights a number of general matters which the Committee addressed during the year and which it considers warrant mention.

Publication of Evidence by Sectional Committees

- 5.2 In the Committee's Report 298 on its activities in 1988-89, attention was drawn to the issue of the protection offered to publishers of evidence given to sectional committees. The Committee had been advised by the Attorney-General's Department that there was some doubt about the extent to which protection was offered to persons other than Committee members, witnesses and staff of Hansard when publishing or otherwise using material which had been authorised for publication by a sectional committee, under sub-section 2(2) of the Parliamentary Papers Act 1908.
- 5.3 There was, and is, no question that complete protection is given when evidence is authorised by the full Committee, nor is there any doubt that Committee members, witnesses and staff of Hansard are protected, as these people are classified as participants in the proceedings of Parliament and therefore fully protected by the Parliamentary Privileges Act 1987.
- The issue has arisen because while the Committee, under the Public Accounts Committee Act 1951, can form sectional committees, the Act does not empower a sectional committee generally to authorise the publication of evidence. And whereas the Parliamentary Papers Act 1908 empowers a committee to authorise the publication of evidence and documents, and the publication of any evidence or document under that authority is immune from civil or criminal legal action, that Act does not apply to sub-committees.
- 5.5 As journalists reporting the proceedings of public hearings conducted by sectional committees are most affected by this anomaly, the Chairman has, since this discovery, made a statement at the commencement of each hearing cautioning the media to exercise care in reporting fairly and accurately.
- 5.6 At the same time, the Committee initiated action to rectify the problem. Agreement was sought, and received, from the Attorney-General to amend

the definition of 'Committee' in the Parliamentary Papers Act 1908 so as to include sub-committees or sectional committees.

- 5.7 However, as noted in Report 307 <u>Activities 1989-90</u>, in a letter dated 28 December 1989 the then Attorney-General, the Hon Lionel Bowen, MP, informed the Committee that adequate protection was conferred by section 16(2)(d) of the Parliamentary Privileges Act 1987. Notwithstanding this, the Attorney-General noted that a question was raised about the relationship between the Parliamentary Papers Act and the Parliamentary Privileges Act which ought to be clarified and he advised that the necessary legislation would be introduced as soon as practicable.
- 5.8 In June 1990, the Chairman wrote to the Attorney-General, the Hon Michael Duffy, MP, seeking urgent advice as to the timing of this legislation. As indicated in Report 307, Mr Duffy reiterated the comments made by his predecessor. Furthermore, he referred to aspects of the relationship of the Parliamentary Privileges Act 1987 to other related legislation which it would wish to consider at the same time. He concluded by saying that his Department was considering the matter "with a view to the preparation and introduction of any necessary legislation as soon as practicable having regard to overall priorities."
- 5.9 The most recent advice from the Attorney-General, following a letter from the Chairman in September 1990, is that sectional committees do not have the power to publish written or oral evidence and that while progress has been made on resolving the relationship between the two Acts "having regard to available resources and other priorities it may be some time before it can be completed."
- 5.10 The delay in finalising this matter is of considerable concern to the Committee.

Developments in Response to Report 296

5.11 In March 1989 the Committee tabled its Report 296 The Auditor-General: Ally of the People and Parliament, which proposed a major reform of the then Australian Audit Office. The Government presented its response to the recommendations in the Report in November of that year. While in agreement with the majority of the recommendations requiring decision, the Government reserved its decision on those recommendations concerning the issues of:

whether the Audit Office should be established as a statutory authority;

- the level of resources for the Office; and
- the mandate of the Auditor-General.
- 5.12 The Government then commissioned the South Australian Auditor-General, Mr Tom Sheridan, to conduct a review of the capacity of the Audit Office to improve further the use of existing resources. At the same time, the Government deferred its consideration of the issues of mandate and statutory authority status until it received the report of Mr Sheridan's review.
- 5.13 This review was completed in early 1990 and in December 1990 the Government announced its decision that the Australian National Audit Office would not received any funds additional to the \$2 million per annum increase which it had agreed to in its initial response to the Committee's Report. The Government's view was that initiatives already undertaken by the Auditor-General or suggested in the review could lead to significant additional resources, equivalent to 60 full-time staff, becoming available for efficiency auditing over the next two years. The Government agreed to a recommendation made by Mr Sheridan that the Office charge for its financial statement audits, including those of departments of state, and that it retain revenue from these audits.
- 5.14 In terms of the other two outstanding issues, the Government rejected the proposal that the Audit Office become a statutory authority but agreed that the Auditor-General should be the sole external auditor of all Commonwealth-owned or controlled entities. The Government did, however, decide that the Minister for Finance could provide exemptions to this.
- 5.15 Report 296 also recommended that the Audit Act 1901 be repealed and replaced by two separate acts covering audit and financial administration. This recommendation was one of the first accepted by the Government and drafting of the new legislation is well underway. During the year, the Committee discussed the proposed content of this legislation with both the Auditor-General and the Secretary of the Department of Finance.
- 5.16 In particular, the Committee advised the Department of Finance of its view that an audit committee of Parliament, as recommended in Report 296, should be established permanently by means of the new Auditor-General Act, which the Department is responsible for drafting. The purpose of this committee would be to advise the Auditor-General on Parliament's audit priorities and to consider the Audit Office's finances in detail. While the Committee acknowledges the Government's response that the audit committee is a matter for the Parliament to decide, it believes that the inclusion of provision for the establishment of the

committee in the forthcoming Auditor-General Bill would be the most efficient way of allowing Parliament to consider the recommendation.

Performance of Witnesses and Observers

- 5.17 The Committee is greatly assisted by the witnesses who appear before it at its public and in camera hearings and, in general, the level and preparedness of witnesses has been satisfactory. Regrettably, during the year the Committee had occasion to write to one departmental secretary about the performance of his witnesses at a public hearing. In drawing attention to this matter, the Committee reminds all departments and agencies of the need to ensure that witnesses are adequately prepared so as to be able to properly respond to the matters raised by the Committee during the course of its inquiries.
- 5.18 Observers from the Department of Finance and the Australian National Audit Office attend each of the Committee's hearings. Their role is to provide the Committee with expert advice on matters under consideration as the need arises during the hearings. With few exceptions, the Committee has found its observers to be most helpful. During the year the Committee considered it timely to review the role of observers and wrote to the Department of Finance and the Audit Office, outlining its expectations of observers and seeking suggestions that they may wish to make which would enhance observers' input to the Committee's inquiries.

APPENDIX A

DUTIES OF THE COMMITTEE

Section 8(1) of the Public Accounts Committee Act 1951 reads as follows:

Subject to sub-section (2), the duties of the Committee are:

- to examine the accounts of the receipts and expenditure
 of the Commonwealth including the financial statements
 transmitted to the Auditor-General under sub-section
 (4) of section 50 of the Audit Act 1901;
- to examine the financial affairs of authorities of the Commonwealth to which this Act applies and of intergovernmental bodies to which this Act applies;
- ab) to examine all reports of the Auditor-General (including reports of the results of efficiency audits) copies of which have been laid before the Houses of the Parliament;
- (b) to report to both Houses of the Parliament, with such comment as it thinks fit, any items or matters in those accounts, statements and reports, or any circumstances connected with them, to which the Committee is of the opinion that the attention of the Parliament should be directed:
- (c) to report to both Houses of the Parliament any alteration which the Committee thinks desirable in the form of the public accounts or in the method of keeping them, or in the mode of receipt, control, issue or payment of public moneys; and
- (d) to inquire into any question in connexion with the public accounts which is referred to it by either House of the Parliament, and to report to that House upon that question,

and include such other duties as are assigned to the Committee by Joint Standing Orders approved by both Houses of the Parliament.
