

CHAIRMAN'S REVIEW



On behalf of the members of the Joint Committee of Public Accounts, I am pleased to present the Committee's annual report of activities for 1993-94.

It was a year in which the Committee tabled 5 reports, published a discussion paper and gave its approval to a new set of annual report requirements for Commonwealth departments.

The most significant of the reports tabled was undoubtedly Report 326, An Assessment of Tax. The inquiry was a major undertaking which generated considerable attention within government circles and the wider community.

It is the Committee's hope that its recommendations will lead to real improvements in the efficiency and effectiveness of Australia's tax system.

It was also a year in which the
Committee gave a renewed focus to its
statutory responsibility to examine
reports of the Auditor-General. The
Committee believes this responsibility
to be one its most important duties.
The Committee has developed new
procedures to allow it to report
regularly to Parliament on its
examination of audit reports.

For over 60 years the Joint Committee of Public Accounts has watched over the expenditure of public money by successive Commonwealth governments. I believe that the Committee's work over the last twelve months has continued the tradition of helping keep the Executive accountable to Parliament.

The Committee's achievements in the last year would not have been possible without the energy, enthusiasm and commitment displayed by my fellow Committee members. For this, I thank them.

On behalf of the Committee I would also like to thank the staff of the Committee secretariat for their dedication and professionalism throughout the year.

MEMBERSHIP OF THE COMMITTEE

Les Scott MP (Chairman)

Les Scott was elected as the Member for Oxley, a Queensland electorate, in 1988. Mr Scott is a member of the Australian Labor Party. Before entering Parliament he worked in the banking industry and was a senior union official. Since 1990 Mr Scott has been on the panel of Deputy Speakers of the House of Representatives. He has been a member of the Joint Committee of Public Accounts since November 1988 and Chairman of the Committee since May 1993.

Alex Somlyay MP (Vice-Chairman)

Alex Somlyay was elected as the Member for Fairfax, an electorate in Queensland, in 1990. Mr Somlyay is a member of the Liberal Party of Australia. Before entering Parliament Mr Somlyay worked as a public servant, ministerial adviser, economics consultant and company director.

Mr Somlyay joined the Joint Committee of Public Accounts in May 1990 and has been Vice-Chairman of the Committee since June 1994.

Julian Beale MP

Julian Beale was elected as the Member for Bruce, a Victorian electorate, in 1984. Mr Beale is a member of the Liberal Party of Australia. Mr Beale has held a number of shadow ministerial responsibilities in his parliamentary career, including housing, employment, training, youth affairs, small business and privatisation. Before entering Parliament Mr Beale worked in the engineering and oil industries, and as a management and investment consultant. Mr Beale joined the Joint Committee of Public Accounts in June 1994.

Hon Bob Brown MP

Bob Brown was first elected to the Commonwealth Parliament in 1980 and is currently the Member for Charlton, an electorate in New South Wales. Mr Brown is a member of the Australian Labor Party. Between 1988 and 1993 Mr Brown held two ministerial portfolios: he was first the Minister for Land Transport and Shipping Support, and, following the 1990 election, he was Minister for Land Transport. Before his election to the Commonwealth Parliament Mr Brown was a member of the New South Wales Parliament and Mayor of the Cessnock City Council, Mr Brown was a member of the Joint Committee of Public Accounts from October 1987 until August 1988, and was reappointed to the Committee in May 1993.

Senator Barney Cooney

Barney Cooney was elected as one of the Senators for Victoria in 1984.

Senator Cooney is a member of the Australian Labor Party. He practised as a barrister at the Victorian Bar before being elected to the Senate. Senator Cooney has had two periods of membership on the Joint Committee of Public Accounts: the first from February 1985 until October 1987, and currently from August 1993.

Mary Easson MP

Mary Easson was elected to the House of Representatives as the Member for Lowe in 1993. She is a member of the Australian Labor Party. Before entering Parliament Mrs Easson was a business consultant specialising in public and government affairs. She joined the Joint Committee of Public Accounts in February 1994.

Eric Fitzgibbon MP

Eric Fitzgibbon was elected as the Member for Hunter, a New South Wales electorate, in 1984. He is a member of the Australian Labor Party. Mr Fitzgibbon is a former high school teacher and Mayor of the City of Cessnock. Mr Fitzgibbon has been a member of the Joint Committee of Public Accounts since October 1987.

Senator Michael Forshaw

Michael Forshaw became a Senator for New South Wales in May 1994. Senator Forshaw is a member of the Australian Labor Party. Senator Forshaw has been admitted as a barrister, and was formerly a senior union official. Senator Forshaw joined the Joint Committee of Public Accounts in May 1994.

Senator Brian Gibson

Brian Gibson was elected to the Senate in 1993 as one of the Senators for Tasmania. He is a member of the Liberal Party of Australia. Prior to his election, Senator Gibson worked in forest-based industries, held a number of company directorships and was

Chairman and Commissioner of the Tasmanian Hydro-Electric Commission. Senator Gibson has been a member of the Joint Committee of Public Accounts since February 1994.

Alan Griffin MP

Alan Griffin is the Member for Corinella. He was elected to this Victorian seat in 1993. Mr Griffin is a member of the Australian Labor Party. He is a former union officer and has worked as a ministerial adviser for both the Victorian and Commonwealth Governments. Mr Griffin joined the Joint Committee of Public Accounts in May 1993.

Chris Haviland MP

Chris Haviland is the Member for Macarthur. He was elected to this New South Wales seat in 1993. He is a member of the Australian Labor Party. Mr Haviland is a former Commonwealth public servant and alderman with the Campbelltown City Council. Mr Haviland has been a member of the Joint Committee of Public Accounts since May 1993.

Senator Belinda Neal

Belinda Neal became a Senator for New South Wales in 1994. She is a member of the Australian Labor Party. Senator Neal is a solicitor, former union officer and councillor with the Gosford City Council. Senator Neal joined the Joint Committee of Public Accounts in March 1994.

1. THE COMMITTEE AND HOW IT WORKS

Duties of the Committee

The Joint Committee of Public Accounts is a committee of the Commonwealth Parliament. The Committee is established pursuant to the Public Accounts Committee Act 1951 and is empowered to scrutinise the moneys spent by Commonwealth agencies from funds appropriated to them.

Specifically, section 8(1) of the Public Accounts Committee Act describes the Committee's duties as being to:

- examine the accounts of the receipts and expenditure of the Commonwealth including the financial statements transmitted to the Auditor-General under sub-section (4) of section 50 of the Audit Act 1901;
- examine the financial affairs of authorities of the Commonwealth to which the Act applies and of inter-governmental bodies to which the Act applies;

- examine all reports of the Auditor-General (including reports of the results of efficiency audits) copies of which have been laid before the Houses of the Parliament;
- Parliament, with such comment as it thinks fit, any items or matters in those accounts, statements and reports, or any circumstances connected with them, to which the Committee is of the opinion that the attention of the Parliament should be directed;
- report to both Houses of the
 Parliament, any alteration which
 the Committee thinks desirable in
 the form of the public accounts or
 in the method of keeping them, or
 in the mode of receipt, control,
 issue or payment of public moneys;
 and

inquire into any question in connection with the public accounts which is referred to it by either House of the Parliament, and to report to that House upon that question.

The Public Accounts Committee Act also empowers the Committee to undertake such other duties as are assigned to it by Joint Standing Orders approved by both Houses of the Parliament.

In addition to these duties, the Committee is responsible for approving annual report guidelines for Commonwealth departments. This responsibility is conferred by section 25 of the *Public Service Act 1922*

Membership of the Committee

The Public Accounts Committee Act provides that a Joint Committee of Public Accounts will be appointed at the beginning of each Parliament, and that the Committee shall have 15 members, five of whom shall be appointed by the Senate and ten of whom shall be appointed by the House of Representatives.

The Committee has a majority of Government members, and, by convention, the Committee is chaired by a Government member. The Vice-Chairman is always a member of the Opposition.

Traditionally the Committee adopts a co-operative and bipartisan approach to its work. The Committee is proud of the fact that of the 330 reports tabled since 1953, all but three have been unanimous.¹

How the Committee Works

Source of Inquiries

The Committee has the capacity to determine its own work program and priorities. This power is derived principally from section 8(1)(b) of the Public Accounts Committee Act, which enables the Committee to report to Parliament on any items or matters in the Commonwealth's Accounts and financial statements or in reports of the Auditor-General, 'or any circumstances

connected with them, to which the Committee is of the opinion that the attention of the Parliament should be directed.'

The other main sources of the Committee's work are described in sections 8(1)(ab) and 8(1)(d) of the Act, which say that the Committee is to examine reports of the Auditor-General and to inquire into any question referred to it by the Parliament.

Recent examples of work arising from each of these sources are:

- Report 326, An Assessment of Tax (a self-initiated inquiry);.
- Report 325, The Midford

 Paramount Case (an inquiry referred by the Senate); and
- Report 330, Review of Auditor-General's Reports May 1991 -September 1992 (which was the result of the Committee's obligations to review reports of the Auditor-General).

Conduct of Inquiries

Although the Committee holds regular private meetings, it generally conducts its inquiries in public.

At the outset of an inquiry, once the terms of reference are settled, the Committee usually advertises its inquiry in the national press. The advertisements call for written submissions from interested individuals and organisations. The Committee also seeks information and comment from people with an expert knowledge of the issues under review.

Further evidence is gathered from inspections, public hearings or as a result of questionnaires prepared by the Committee.

The Committee is assisted by a full time secretariat, by observers from the Department of Finance and by observers and secondees from the Australian National Audit Office. The Committee also frequently employs consultants to provide advice on particular issues.

The Committee's reports are tabled in both Houses of Parliament and copies are distributed to all Ministers and Commonwealth agencies with an interest in the subject of the report.

Copies of the report are also sent to witnesses, those who have made submissions and others with an interest in the work of the Committee.

Responses to Reports

Government responses to reports of the Committee can be transmitted in two ways: either by means of a Finance Minute (in those cases where the Committee's recommendations address administrative matters) or by means of a Government response (where the Committee has made policy recommendations).

The Finance Minute process has been in place since 1952. The process involves the preparation of a minute to the Committee by the Secretary of the Department of Finance. The minute contains a response from each relevant Commonwealth agency to each of the Committee's recommendations.

A Finance Minute is usually received by the Committee within six months of the tabling of a report. It is the Committee's practice to table Finance Minutes in the Parliament as soon as practicable after they are received. The Committee also publishes an annual compilation of all Finance Minutes tabled in the preceding calendar year.

The receipt and tabling of Finance
Minutes gives the Committee an
opportunity to comment on the departmental responses. A recent example of
such comment can be found in Report
327, Finance Minute on Report 325,
which contained the Committee's
comments on aspects of the Finance
Minute prepared in response to the
Committee's Report 325, The Midford
Paramount Case and Related Matters.

Ultimately, if the Committee is dissatisfied with the contents of a particular Finance Minute, it may decide to re-open its inquiry. Where the Committee makes recommendations of a policy nature, a separate Government response is prepared by the responsible Minister. The Government has given a commitment to the Parliament that responses to parliamentary committee reports will be provided within three months of the report being tabled.

It is usual practice for the relevant Minister to table a Government response in the Parliament.

2. REPORTS AND OTHER ACHIEVEMENTS

Introduction

The Committee tabled five reports in the financial year 1993-94. This chapter contains a brief summary of each report. The Committee's approval of new annual report requirements for Commonwealth departments is also described.

Report 326 - An Assessment of Tax

Report 326 presented the findings of the Committee's inquiry into the administration of the Australian Taxation Office. The Inquiry was the first major public examination of the way our tax laws are administered since 1936, when the Income Tax Assessment Act was enacted.

The inquiry was concerned with the administration of the tax system.

Questions of tax mix and policy were not considered. In broad terms, the Committee found that the Australian Taxation Office has, over the last decade, been a progressive and generally efficient organisation.

Nevertheless, the Committee considered that more could be done to reduce the costs associated with tax administration and compliance, and to improve access to justice for taxpayers. The Committee made 148 recommendations with these aims in mind.

Some of the key recommendations were that:

- the Income Tax Assessment Act be rewritten and simplified;
- the Tax Office be reconstituted as the Australian Taxation
 Commission, and supported by a strengthened system of profession-based advisory committees;
- a small claims tribunal be established to hear taxation claims of up to \$5000 in value; and
- all rulings made by the Tax

 Commissioner be tabled in

 Parliament.

The Committee was pleased to note that in November 1993, shortly after Report 326 was tabled, the then Treasurer, the Hon John Dawkins MP, announced the establishment of a Tax Law Improvement Project to re-write and simplify the Income Tax Assessment Act.

A complete response to Report 326 had not been received as at 30 June 1994.

Report 327 - Finance Minute on Report 325

Report 327 contains the Finance
Minute in relation to the Committee's
Report 325, The Midford Paramount
Case and Related Matters, and the
Committee's comments on those
sections of the Finance Minute
prepared by the Director of Public
Prosecutions.

The Midford Paramount inquiry examined the actions of the Australian Customs Service and others, including the Director of Public Prosecutions, in prosecuting a case against the former shirt manufacturing company Midford Paramount.

The Committee's report was highly critical of the various agencies involved in the case. The Government accepted the Committee's findings and, in November 1993, announced a compensation payment of more than \$25m to the former directors and agents of Midford Paramount.

In these circumstances the Committee was surprised that the Director of Public Prosecutions chose to make comments critical of the Committee and its inquiry in the Finance Minute for Report 325. The Committee was concerned that the comments, if read in isolation, could present a reader with an inaccurate and incomplete understanding of the Committee's inquiry and report. Accordingly, the Committee decided to publish, in Report 327, a commentary on the response from the Director of Public Prosecutions.

Report 328 - Report of Activities 1992-93

Report 328 is a report on the Committee's activities for the 1992-93 financial year. It contains information on reports tabled in 1992-93 and comments on inquiries current at that time.

Report 330 - Review of Auditor-General's Reports, May 1991 -September 1992

Report 330 contains a review of 72 reports of the Auditor-General, most of which were tabled in the period between May 1991 and September 1992.

The review enabled the Committee to re-visit a series of audits which had been conducted some years previously.

In the vast majority of audit reports which were reviewed, the audited agencies had agreed with the recommendations contained in the reports, and had taken appropriate remedial action. However, the Committee did uncover some instances where the agency response had been inappropriate or ineffective, or where there was a difference of opinion between the agency and Australian National Audit Office.

In these cases the Committee made recommendations aimed at encouraging improved performance, or resolving any disputed issues.

New Annual Report Requirements

Pursuant to section 25(7) of the Public Service Act, the annual reports of Commonwealth departments are required to be prepared in accordance with guidelines which are presented to the Parliament by the Prime Minister, after approval by the Joint Committee of Public Accounts.

Following the Government's decision to bring forward the Budget to May, the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet reviewed the nature and timing of the documents produced in support of the Budget, and sought the Committee's approval for a new series of annual report requirements.

Key elements in the new reporting framework proposed by the Department were that:

- annual reports would have to be tabled by the relevant Minister no later than 31 October;
- annual reports would become the key document for reporting past year program performance; and
- to sharpen the focus on program performance, much of the administrative detail formerly contained in annual reports would be held by departments and made available on request, rather than being published in annual reports.

The Committee held a series of meetings with departmental officials to discuss the proposed new requirements and, after negotiating a number of changes, gave its approval to the new requirements in March 1994.

The Government has accepted the Committee's suggestion that the new requirements should be evaluated after 12 months in operation.

3. WORK IN PROGRESS

Introduction

This chapter provides a brief description of the inquiries being conducted by the Committee as at 30 June 1994. An account is given of the status of each inquiry, together with an overview of the issues being considered.

Commercialisation of Public Sector Operations

The inquiry into commercialisation was announced at the end of June 1993 with the following terms of reference:

- to inquire into issues raised by the provision of goods and/or services on a commercial basis by

 Government agencies, including:
- the efficiency, effectiveness and appropriateness of corporations as a means of service delivery to the public; and

 the accountability of commercialised Government agencies and the mechanisms needed to ensure their accountability; and

while not limiting its scope, the inquiry will focus on three Government agencies:

- the Department of the Arts and Administrative Services;
- the Civil Aviation Authority; and
- the Federal Airports
 Corporation.

The Committee undertook the inquiry in the context of moves within the Commonwealth public service over the last decade to provide, on a commercial basis, services which had previously been funded from the Budget. The inquiry does not encompass all aspects of commercialisation, but is limited to the operation of government business enterprises and business units in departments of state.

By 30 June 1994 the Committee had received 155 written submissions; held eleven public hearings; and undertaken seven inspections or site visits.

Three key issues have emerged so far:

- Government businesses which have multiple, conflicting objectives are disadvantaged in their attempts to focus on their commercial objectives. There is strong evidence to suggest that if government businesses are to be successful, they should be allowed to focus on their commercial functions regulatory and policy functions should be placed in separate agencies.
- It is important to distinguish social objectives from commercial objectives. Clearly defining community service obligations is a valuable way of ensuring the delivery of essential services that cannot be provided at commercially viable prices. However, in practice, a number of problems have been encountered in the development, funding and monitoring of community service obligations.

- As more public services are being commercialised, significant issues of accountability arise. Questions are being asked about:
 - the effect of commercialisation on the accountability of government businesses;
 - the extent to which accountability is to Ministers and the Parliament, as opposed to customers; and
 - the accountability implications for Parliament of the partial privatisation of government businesses.

Much evidence has also been received on the need for competitive neutrality between government businesses and private sector competitors; and the profound impact of commercialisation on the culture, structure and size of the organisations in which it has been introduced.

Administration of Commonwealth-State Agreements

Specific Purpose Payments (SPPs) form a large and increasing proportion of Commonwealth financial assistance to the States and Territories.

A number of reviews by the Auditor-General and other agencies have highlighted considerable potential for improvement in the administration of Commonwealth-State agreements for SPPs. Disquiet with the administration and management of SPPs is also felt at the State level and a Council of Australian Governments working group is currently seeking to identify those functional areas 'which exhibit inefficiencies' in existing intergovernmental arrangements.

With this background, the Committee decided to conduct an inquiry into the administration of Commonwealth-State agreements for SPPs. As at 30 June 1994 the inquiry was still in the preliminary stages and public hearings had not been held.

However, the Committee and the Australian National Audit Office have jointly prepared a questionnaire which will be distributed to all Commonwealth departments responsible for SPPs. The aim of the questionnaire is to determine how SPPs are administered and whether there are specific examples of good practice which could be widely adopted. The Committee expects to conclude its inquiry in mid-1995.

New Financial Management and Audit Legislation

On 29 June 1994 the House of Representatives referred to the Committee for its consideration and report a package of three Bills to replace the Audit Act. The Bills were the Financial Management and Accountability Bill 1994, the Commonwealth Authorities and Companies Bill 1994 and the Auditor-General Bill 1994.

The Committee has had a long interest in the Commonwealth's financial management and audit legislation. In a report tabled in 1989, Report 296, The Auditor-General: Ally of the People and the Parliament - Reform of the Audit Office, the Committee recommended that the Audit Act be repealed and replaced with legislation that allowed more effective and flexible financial management.

The Committee is pleased that the replacement legislation has been introduced, and gratified that the Bills have been referred to it for consideration.

The consideration of Bills by parliamentary committees represents a new maturity in the way of making legislation. It is a responsibility which the Committee takes seriously and the Committee's report on the Bills will be tabled early in the 1994 spring sittings of Parliament.

Government's Proposal to Establish an Audit Committee of Parliament

In Report 296, The Auditor-General:
Ally of the People and the Parliament
the Committee also recommended that
an audit committee of Parliament be
established. The Government took no
action on this recommendation until
29 June 1994 when the Leader of the
Government in the Senate, Senator the
Hon Robert Ray, proposed a motion
that an audit committee be established.
A day later, before voting on Senator
Ray's motion, the Senate resolved in
the following terms:

That the proposed resolution for the establishment of an Audit Committee be referred to the Joint Committee of Public Accounts for inquiry and report by 23 August 1994, and that the committee, in conducting its inquiry, give particular attention to the appropriateness of establishing a separate committee rather than conferring the functions of the proposed committee on the Joint Committee of Public Accounts,1

The Committee will be reporting on this matter in conjunction with its report on the new financial management and audit legislation.

Auditor-General's Reports

In addition to preparing and tabling Report 330, the Committee began work on its review of the 38 reports produced by the Auditor-General in the period 1992-93, and the 43 audit reports tabled in 1993-94. Broadly, the Committee's aim when reviewing reports of the Auditor-General is to assess whether the audited agencies have responded appropriately to the Auditor-General's recommendations. The Committee's review procedures are described in greater detail in Chapter 4.

In the period 1993-94, the Committee paid particular attention to the following audit reports:

4. REVIEWING REPORTS OF THE AUDITOR-GENERAL

Introduction

The Auditor-General makes an essential contribution to the system of public accountability. He is the external auditor of the Executive Government and has a duty to report directly to Parliament on 'the integrity, economy and efficiency of the financial operations of government.'

The Auditor-General performs a role that Parliament itself is not suited to. The Auditor-General has the resources, knowledge and technical expertise needed to assess whether government agencies present financial statements which fairly represent their financial position and which comply with relevant laws and standards.

The Parliament also looks to the Auditor-General for assurances that government agencies perform their functions efficiently and effectively.

The Auditor-General, the Parliament and its committees all play a role in the cycle of public accountability. The close links between the Auditor-General and the Parliament are recognised and reinforced by the Public Accounts Committee Act, which requires the Joint Committee of Public Accounts to examine all reports of the Auditor-General which are tabled in Parliament.

The main aim of this chapter is to highlight the importance of these links, and to make known the procedures the Committee adopts in examining reports of the Auditor-General.

The Committee's Statutory Role

The role of the Committee in examining reports of the Auditor-General is neither discretionary nor constrained in any way.

It is a role which the Committee considers to be important in the process of ensuring that the Executive is held to account by the Parliament.

Throughout its history the Committee has periodically produced reports based on its consideration of reports of the Auditor-General.² The most recent example is the Committee's Report 330, Review of Auditor-General's Reports, May 1991 - September 1992, which reported on the Committee's examination of the 72 reports of the Auditor-General presented between May 1991 and September 1992.

The Committee sees the primary purpose of its reviews as being to assess whether audited agencies have responded appropriately to the Auditor-General's findings.

In considering whether a response is appropriate, the Committee would usually address such matters as:

- . the nature of the audit findings;
- the purpose of the audit recommendations:
- any action taken by the audited agency; and

 the contribution made by the audit process to improvements in public administration.

The Committee is conscious of not going over ground already well covered during an audit and, in most cases, will focus on any disputed issues and on whether agencies have acted upon their initial responses.

It is possible, indeed not uncommon, that during the course of its reviews the Committee will identify issues requiring more comprehensive scrutiny. For example, the Committee's current inquiry into the commercialisation of public sector operations, had its beginnings in a series of audit reports which drew attention to some of the administrative, regulatory and accountability consequences of commercialisation.³

Review by Other Parliamentary Committees

In addition to the Committee's statutory review process, the House of Representatives has, over the last decade, developed the practice of occasionally referring audit reports to its standing committees, and to certain joint committees.⁴

The referral of audit reports to other committees is appropriate in some circumstances - for example, where an audit report is relevant to a subject already being considered by another committee, or where an audit report deals with an issue in which another committee has developed a particular expertise.

However, it is important to note that the requirement to review described in the Public Accounts Committee Act is not satisfied by the referral of an audit report to another committee. The Act is specific in its requirement that the Joint Committee of Public Accounts examine all audit reports.

Although the Committee is aware of the need to avoid unnecessary duplication, it intends to fulfil its obligation by examining all audit reports, including those which have been referred to other committees. In most cases it is likely that the Committee's examination will show that the other committee has reviewed, or is reviewing, the major issues identified in the audit report. However, there may be occasions when the Committee decides that further review is needed.

The Committee's Review Procedures

The procedure adopted by the Committee in its most recent review of audit reports, which resulted in *Report 330*, was broadly as follows:

first, the Committee wrote to each of the agencies involved in the audit reports being reviewed, asking them to describe the actions they had taken in response to the audit findings, and to provide a timetable for implementing those recommendations still outstanding;

- secondly, the Committee reviewed the submissions it received and sought comment from the Australian National Audit Office; and
- finally, the Committee decided whether further information was needed and, if so, whether to seek it in writing or at a public hearing.

The procedure was aimed at gathering sufficient information to enable the Committee to assess whether the audited agencies had responded in an appropriate and timely manner to the audit findings.

While preparing its report of that review, the Committee formed the opinion that, in many cases, there were advantages to be gained from delaying its examination of an audit report until some months after the audit report had been presented.

The principal advantage is that a delay allows the audited agency time to react to the recommendations contained in the audit report and to implement any responses it has agreed to. If comments are sought from agencies immediately after an audit report has been presented, agencies are often unable to provide any more information than is contained in the audit report.

The Committee considers that a delay of six months between the presentation of an audit report and the beginning of its review is likely to allow better judgements to be made about the appropriateness and timeliness of agency responses.

In the light of its experience, and in the interests of making its intentions clear, the Committee has decided to refine its procedures for reviewing audit reports.

The New Review Procedures

The new procedures, which are outlined below, describe each stage of the review process, beginning with the tabling of an audit report in Parliament.

Stage One - Determining Review Action

- (1) The audit report is tabled.
- (2) A period of at least three sitting days elapses in the House, in which time interested parties consider whether the audit report should be referred to a House standing committee.
- (3) If the audit report is referred to another committee, the Committee would usually delay its examination until after the other committee has completed its inquiry.
- (4) If a motion to refer is not proposed within 5 sitting days of tabling, the Committee will set in train its review process.

Stage Two - Advice to Agencies and Initial Evidence Gathering

(5) After 5 sitting days have elapsed, the Committee will write to the heads of all agencies involved in, or affected by, the audit report, advising them of the Committee's responsibility to review all audit reports and seeking written comment on issues raised in the audit report. The due date for comment will be six months after the audit report was tabled.

Stage Three - Assessment of Evidence

(6) After considering the initial evidence received from agencies and other sources, including the Australian National Audit Office the Committee will determine whether further evidence is required and, if so, whether to seek additional comments in writing or to hold public hearings.

Stage Four - Reporting

(7) After assessing the evidence the Committee will prepare a report which will be tabled in both Houses of Parliament.

The Committee intends to table, approximately every twelve months, a compilation report containing the results of the Committee's consideration of an annual series of audit reports.⁵

At times the circumstances of a particular audit report may require the Committee's urgent attention, in which case it is likely the Committee would commence its review immediately and produce a separate report.

APPENDIX VI - REPORTS PRESENTED BY JOINT COMMITTEES OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTS ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO THE COMMITTEE OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTS ACT 1913

In December 1913 the Commonwealth Parliament enacted the Committee of Public Accounts Act 1913. The Act provided that 'as soon as conveniently practicable after the commencement of this Act, and thereafter at the commencement of the first session of every Parliament, a joint committee of nine members of Parliament, to be called the Joint Committee of Public Accounts shall be appointed.'

The Committee first met in Melbourne on 4 December 1914 and produced its first report, on the general financial position of the Commonwealth Small Arms Factory in Lithgow (New South Wales), on 27 May 1915.

In December 1951 the *Public Accounts Committee Act 1951* came into effect. The Act, as amended, provides that 'as soon as practicable after the commencement of each session of Parliament, a joint committee of 15 members of the Parliament (to be known as the Joint Committee of Public Accounts) shall be appointed.'

The Committee first met in Canberra on 2 October 1952 and produced its first report, on the supplementary estimates for 1951-52, on 5 March 1953.
